#### **DISCUSSION:**

Enterprise Zones were established in 1984 to stimulate business investment in depressed areas of the State and to create job opportunities for Californians. The State has forty-two (42) Enterprise Zones established for 15-year periods.

A provision of the California Government Code provides for a Targeted Employment Area (TEA) within an Enterprise Zone. Section 7072(i) of the Government Code defines a TEA as an area within a County that is composed solely of those census tracts that have at least 51 percent of its residents of low- or moderate-income levels. Its purpose is to encourage businesses in an Enterprise Zone to hire eligible residents from these geographic areas. The incentive for these businesses is the availability of a tax credit for hiring residents who reside in a TEA.

The statutes governing the Enterprise Zone Program require that each zone update its TEA within 180 days of new census data becoming available. The Section of the code which refers to this requirement is outlined below:

7072 (i)(4)

(A)Within 180 days of updated United States census data becoming available, each local government entity of each city, county, or city and county that has jurisdiction of an enterprise zone shall approve, by resolution or ordinance, boundaries of its targeted employment area reflecting the new census data. If no changes are necessary to the boundaries based on the most current census data, the enterprise zone may send a letter to the department stating that a review has been undertaken by the respective local governmental entities and no boundary changes are required

The State of California Department of Housing and Community Development has determined that the census data necessary to update TEAs, in accordance with the relative statutes, was made available in December 2012 via the United States Census Bureau's American Community Survey five year averages.

As per statute's requirement, the identified census tracts have been determined by the United States Department of Housing & Urban development to have at least 51 percent of its residents at or below low or moderate income levels. The qualifying median household income for Stanislaus County has been set at \$48,137.45. Additionally, the following TEA census tracts located in the Cities of Ceres, Hughson, Modesto, Newman, Oakdale, Patterson, Riverbank, Turlock, Waterford and the unincorporated areas of Stanislaus County:

To update the Stanislaus County Enterprise Zone TEA, the County must submit specified documentation, including a resolution and a map of the TEA boundaries that

includes the qualifying census tracts. The proposed TEA Census Tract is attached as Attachment A, and a map of the proposed TEA for the Stanislaus County Enterprise Zone is attached as Attachment B.

At this time, staff is recommending the Board of Supervisors approve to the boundaries of the Targeted Employment Area for the Stanislaus County Enterprise Zone and authorize the Zone Manager to submit the application to the California State Department of Housing and Community Development.

#### **POLICY ISSUES:**

The Board of Supervisors should consider if the approval to update the boundaries of the targeted employment for the Stanislaus County Enterprise Zone and submission of an application to the California State Department of Housing and Community Development is consistent with the priorities of A Strong Local Economy, A Strong Local Agricultural Economy/Heritage and Effective Partnerships.

#### STAFFING IMPACTS:

The Stanislaus Economic Development and Workforce Alliance has been identified as the Enterprise Zone Administrator. The Chief Executive Office, Office of County Counsel and Departments of Planning and Community Development and Public Works provide technical assistance as needed.

WHEREAS, the Stanislaus Economic Development & Workforce Alliance, the lead agency of the Stanislaus Enterprise Zone, is submitting a Targeted Employment Area application to the State Enterprise and Economic Development Section, Department of Housing and Community Development for designation of a Targeted Employment Area (TEA);

WHEREAS, these Census Tracts have at least 51% of its residents at low – to moderate income levels using the most recent United States Department of Census data available;

WHEREAS, the CITY/COUNTY has the jurisdiction of the Stanislaus Enterprise Zone and of the Census Tracts and identifies these residents are those in most need of employment targeting;

WHEREAS, the Census Tracts and the Stanislaus Enterprise Zone are in the jurisdiction of Stanislaus County and the Cities of Ceres, Hughson, Modesto, Newman, Oakdale, Patterson, Riverbank, Turlock, and Waterford; and
