Approval for the Sheriff to Replace One Canine in the Sheriff's Department Canine Unit

DISCUSSION:

In March 2009, the Sheriff's Department purchased canine Blade from Adlerhorst International Inc. for \$10,344. Canine Blade was a two year old male Belgian Malinois breed and was returned as it was determined he was unable to perform the required duties of a patrol canine. There were numerous attempts by Deputy Sheriff Lloyd MacKinnon, the canine's handler, to correct the canine's patrol working ability but were ultimately unsuccessful. Canine Blade's last day of service was October 20, 2009.

On October 24, 2009 the Sheriff's Department received canine Kiko, a two and a half year old male Belgian Malinois breed, in exchange for returning canine Blade. Canine Kiko's first day of service was November 8, 2009. Canine Kiko was assigned to Deputy Sheriff Lloyd Mackinnon who left the K9 unit in 2013 to become a Community Deputy. His canine was reassigned to Deputy Arthur Parra who has made numerous attempts to correct the canine's patrol working ability since being reassigned but has been ultimately unsuccessful. The canine is outside the one year warranty time frame. Alderhorst International Inc. has agreed to sell the canine and provide the Sheriff's Department credit toward the purchase of a new canine.

The Board has previously approved the return of canine Blade in exchange for canine Kiko. This item is being submitted to the Board of Supervisors' to approve the replacement of canine Kiko.

POLICY ISSUES:

Approval of this action supports the Board of Supervisors' priorities of A Safe Community.
