Chief Doerksen read the fire reports. There were 29 calls with the breakdown as follows: 1 structure; 17 EMS; 3 injury accident; 1 vehicle fire; 2 grass fires; 1 station standby and 4 mutual aids. Hartman/Enos moved to pay the bills. Motion carried.

The water tender committee is still working on revising the specs and obtaining revised bids.

Hartman moved that the district pay for the three current fire chiefs and their guests to attend the Annual Chief's Dinner on January 23. Bryson seconded the motion and the motion carried.

Total reimbursement for the 2013 Bridge Fire strike team will be \$7,208.15.

Hartman moved that a request be sent to the Stanislaus County Board of Supervisors to approve a change from an annual district audit to a biennial district audit beginning with the 2013-14 fiscal year. Enos seconded the motion and the motion carried.

The 2012-13 audit report was distributed to the commissioners.

Hartman moved that pump tests be performed on four fire engines by Hi-Tech at a cost of \$200 per test. Enos seconded the motion and the motion carried.

Bryson moved that Dan Kenyan be hired to perform 90-Day BIT Vehicle Inspections on six engines at a cost of \$40 per inspection. Hartman seconded the motion and the motion carried.

Ladder test bids will be presented at the next meeting.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:41 p.m.
