DISCUSSION:

It has been the Department's practice to retire canines to their handlers when they reach an age or condition where they can no longer be of service. There is a need to retire one (1) of the Sheriff's Department current canines. Canine Vito is a nine year-old male German Short Hair Pointer breed that began service with the Sheriff's Department in Adult Detention in **2006**.

The Sheriff's Department desires to retire canine Vito from law enforcement service and enter into a retirement contract with his current handler, Deputy Cory Meyer. This item is being submitted to the Board of Supervisors to approve the contract necessary to implement this action.

Approval of this action supports the Board of Supervisors' priorities of A Safe Community and Effective Partnerships.

CANINE RETIREMENT CONTRACT

This AGREEMENT, made and entered into in the County of Stanislaus, State of California, this 11th day of **March**, 2014, by and between the County of Stanislaus, hereinafter referred to as "COUNTY", and Cory Meyer hereinafter referred to as "OWNER".

This AGREEMENT is made with regard to the following recitals which are part of this agreement:

- A. OWNER wishes to assume ownership and take possession of that certain canine named Vito, who is being retired from law enforcement service, described as a Male German Short Hair Pointer breed.

- B. OWNER wishes to continue and maintain custody of the above-referenced dog, and COUNTY wishes to divest itself of both ownership and all liability for any and all damages caused by the subject dog.




- C. COUNTY does hereby agree to relinquish all of it's or the rights, title and ownership interest in said dog whatsoever, effective upon OWNER's execution and return of this document and payment of the sum of \$1.00 to the COUNTY.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of this AGREEMENT, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. OWNER does assume ownership of the canine named Vito, and any and all risks arising from actions of said dog, including, but not limited to, risk of injury or death to third persons, and shall defend, indemnify and hold COUNTY harmless from any and all liability, claims, administrative proceedings or other responsibility whatsoever arising from any injuries or damages that may occur

on or after the date ownership of the dog is transferred pursuant to this AGREEMENT. That date is hereby fixed by agreement by and among the parties hereto as being **March 11th**, 2014.

2. COUNTY further agrees to continue to be responsible for all liability for risks and dangers relating to the ownership of the subject canine before the aforementioned date, and to indemnify and hold OWNER harmless in the event that any legal or administrative action, whether by claim, demand or otherwise, is made by any person or entity as a consequence of or arising out of any event, act or disturbance involving the subject police dog before the date ownership is transferred from COUNTY to OWNER.
3. OWNER acknowledges that he has read the foregoing AGREEMENT and understands each of its provisions, and agrees to all terms.
4. OWNER agrees to pay the sum of \$1.00.
