#### DISCUSSION:

The Stanislaus County Parks Master Plan recommends improvements to amenities in the Regional Parks. Over the past years, the Department has been utilizing Public Facility Fees (PFF) to improve Woodward and Modesto Regional Parks, including installing additional vaulted restrooms, a security system, picnic tables, barbeques, picnic tables, and fire rings. In addition, playground equipment was installed at the Frank Raines Regional Park and a shade shelter was recently completed at Laird Regional Park.

On February 4, 2014, the Stanislaus County Public Facilities Fees Committee reviewed and recommended the following requests for approval:

- Laird Park Fencing Project \$72,000
- Modesto and Woodward Reservoir (14) Vaulted Restrooms \$58,943.06
- Modesto Reservoir Fuel Pump Project \$34,557
- Modesto Reservoir 4 yard bins (25) \$16,000
- Modesto Reservoir (20) Hot Coal Receptacles \$12,000, \$3,944.40 funded by Public Facilities Fees.

In 2012, volunteers renovated Laird Regional Park by installing a new irrigation well and sprinkler system, turf, and the trimming of trees. Using PFF, the Department installed a 40'x60' shade structure, barbeques, serving tables, and horseshoe pits for family reunions and special events. The Department is requesting to use PFF for a fencing project that will provide additional benefits by preventing vehicles from driving on the grass, ensuring safety for the community using the park, and preventing vandalism of the turf and sprinklers.

On April 17, 2012, the Board approved using PFF to purchase and install additional vaulted restrooms at Woodward and Modesto Reservoir Regional Parks and for the installation of fuel pump card readers at Modesto Reservoir. The request was for \$527,249.94 for the restrooms and \$56,175 for the fuel pumps. At the time of purchase, both project costs came in higher than first estimated and the Department is requesting approval for the additional funds needed to complete the restroom project (\$58,943.06) and the fuel pumps (\$34,557).

Improving amenities at Modesto Reservoir Regional Park include placing 4-yard bins and hot coal receptacles throughout the park, which will allow for safe disposal of ashes from fire pits and barbeques.

### **POLICY ISSUE:**

The recommended actions are consistent with the Board's priorities of A Healthy Community, A Well Planned Infrastructure System, and the Efficient Delivery of Public Services by promoting a safe environment and improved quality of life in the community.

# **STAFFING IMPACTS:**

Increased labor needs due to additional restrooms, 4-yard bins and hot coal receptacles will be absorbed with current Department staff until such time as increased revenue will allow for additional staffing.
