#### **DISCUSSION:**

The Stanislaus Child Development Local Planning Council (LPC) was established by the Board of Supervisors pursuant to the State of California Assembly Bill (AB) 1542 & California Education Code 8499 on July 28, 1998 to provide a forum for the identification of local priorities for child care and the development of policies to meet the needs identified within those priorities.

California Education Code 8499 requires each local planning council by May 30<sup>th</sup> of each year, upon approval by the County Board of Supervisors and the County Superintendent of Schools, to submit to the California Department of Education (CDE) any changes to the local priorities it identifies that reflect all child care needs in the county. Priority levels are reported to the CDE by program and zip code, and are based on percentages of eligible children as well as specific numbers of children not receiving program services, with "Priority 1" representing the level with the greatest need. The priority information that is provided in the report assists the CDE in determining which zip codes should receive funding made available through CDE Request for Funding Applications.

The LPC is required to determine zip code priorities for the General Child Care and Development program and the State Preschool Child Care and Development programs. In Stanislaus County, the General Child Care and Development program primarily serves infants and toddlers. There are also a few school-age children served under this program. State Preschool Child Care and Development serves children that turn 3 or 4 years old on or before October 2<sup>nd</sup> of the fiscal year. Eligibility for the programs is determined by need, family size and income.

The attached Stanislaus Child Development Local Planning Council 2014-2015 Priorities Report reflects the following changes to the priorities in Stanislaus County based on the 2010 Census data, state income guidelines, and formulary provided by CDE:

Priorities are a part of the mandated requirements for the LPC. The priorities are submitted for California Department of Education (CDE) use. In the event that funding is made available through a CDE Request for Funding Applications (RFA), the LPC priorities would be used to assist CDE in determining which zip codes should receive funding. For example, using the proposed 2014-2015 priorities for State Preschool Child Care Development programs if funding were to be released all areas of the county that are listed as Priority 1, example 95380 (Turlock), would be eligible for funding before those listed in Priority 2, example 95386 (Waterford).

The Agency requests the Board of Supervisors to approve the Stanislaus Child Development Local Planning Council 2014-2015 Report.
