Approval to Proclaim the Week of October 20 through October 26, 2014 as Second Chance Week in Stanislaus County, in Conjunction with National and Statewide Events Promoting Reuse and Recycling Activities

DISCUSSION:

Second Chance Week is a public awareness campaign held nationwide and in California each October to promote reuse, repair, resale, and donation opportunities. Items that might otherwise have been thrown away are given a "second chance." This year, the week of October 20 through October 26, 2014, is being proclaimed Second Chance Week. The Director of Environmental Resources is requesting the Board of Supervisors proclaim this same week as "Second Chance Week" in Stanislaus County. Second Chance Week will allow individuals and communities the opportunity to reaffirm their commitment to conservation and apply the concept that reuse is the best form of recycling.

In addition to joining in the spirit of recycling, the Countywide Integrated Waste Management Plan, which was updated and approved by the Board of Supervisors on June 28, 2011, includes a waste management hierarchy of which reuse is identified as the highest priority. Consistent with this hierarchy, the Department of Environmental Resources (DER) encourages individuals, businesses, communities, and government agencies to work together as good stewards of natural resources. Using resources wisely helps to build a stronger economy, preserve and improve the environment.

To promote reuse during Second Chance Week, DER proposes to partner with the City of Modesto, Salvation Army, Center for Human Services and Modesto Pregnancy Center in addition to the fire stations and libraries within both jurisdictions. The fire stations and libraries will be contacted and asked to be a collection site for new and gently used baby clothes donated by the public. The items collected will be delivered to the Salvation Army, Center for Human Services and Modesto Pregnancy Center for distribution. Collected items will be used to help families in need within Stanislaus County. This information is also available on the department web site at http://stancounty.com/er/.

To further promote the reuse program, DER will create flyers advertising Second Chance Week that will be distributed to collection sites and surrounding businesses. DER will deliver the flyers and containers prior to Second Chance Week, and will collect the containers at the end of that week.

POLICY ISSUE:

Proclaiming the week of October 20 through October 26, 2014, as Second Chance Week is consistent with the Board's priorities of A Safe Community, A Healthy Community, and Effective Partnerships by providing a program that supports the Department's mission to promote a safe and healthy environment and improve the quality of life in the community through a balance of science, education, partnerships, and environmental regulation.

STAFFING IMPACTS:

Existing department staff will be coordinating this event.
