SUBJECT:

Approval to Declare Sheriff Vehicle 07-06 as Surplus and Authorize Donation of the K-9 Vehicle to the City of Ceres

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. Declare vehicle 07-06, a 2007 Ford Crown Victoria K-9 vehicle, as surplus.
2. Authorize the Sheriff to donate vehicle 07-06, a 2007 Ford Crown Victoria K-9 vehicle, to the City of Ceres Public Safety Department, Emergency Services Division, for use in their K-9 Accelerant Detection Program.
3. Authorize the Purchasing Agent to sign the release of liability for vehicle 07-06.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Vehicle 07-06, a 2007 Ford Crown Victoria K-9 vehicle, has been rotated out of service due to its current mileage of 109,097 being beyond the minimum mileage replacement threshold of 100,000 set by Fleet Services Policy 8.B. adopted on March 12, 2013 by the Board of Supervisors. The K-9 vehicle is now considered surplus and has an estimated resale value of \$1,900, however, it would require an estimated \$538 in labor costs to remove the K-9 cage and equipment inside the vehicle to prepare it for sale. There is no cost to the General Fund to make the donation.

Approval to Declare Vehicle 07-06 as Surplus and Authorize Donation of the K-9 Vehicle to the City of Ceres

DISCUSSION:

The City of Ceres Public Safety Department, Emergency Services Division, is in need of a K-9 vehicle for their Accelerant K-9 Detection Program. As of June 30, 2014, the Sheriff has one 2007 Ford Crown Victoria, vehicle 07-06, that is outfitted for K-9 use. Vehicle 07-06 was rotated out of service with the Sheriff's Department in February 2014 due to its current mileage 109,097 being beyond the County's minimum mileage replacement threshold of 100,000. General Services Agency Fleet Manager has evaluated the vehicle and determined it could not be used for any other purpose and would be sent for surplus.

The City of Ceres would appreciate the donation of the Sheriff's K-9 vehicle which is ready for its intended beneficial K-9 use by the Public Safety Department's Emergency Services Division. General Services Agency's Fleet Services has used Kelly Blue Book to determine the nominal value of the vehicle at approximately \$1,900. Fleet Services has estimated that if the Sheriff were to sell the vehicle at auction, the Department would have to go through the time and expense of removing the K-9 cage to prepare it for sale. This removal would take 5 hours of labor at an estimated cost to the Department of \$538. The K-9 equipment that would be removed is not usable due to its specific design for the Ford Crown Victoria that has been discontinued.

It is recommended that the Board of Supervisors declare the K-9 vehicle as surplus and donate the equipment to the City of Ceres. Transfer of the surplus K-9 vehicle will reduce the amount of space needed to store the vehicle at Fleet Services. The potential revenue from the sale of the equipment would be offset by the benefits to the community during the next few years. The equipment was previously purchased November 14, 2006 for \$23,835 to support investigations and K-9 services for Stanislaus County. The City of Ceres will continue to use this equipment to provide similar services to the local community.

Attached is a release of liability signed by the City of Ceres which will release Stanislaus County from liability with respect to vehicle 07-06 after the transfer of the vehicle to the City of Ceres.

POLICY ISSUES:

This action meets the Board's priority of Effective Partnerships and Efficient Delivery of Public Services by helping to enhance services of a local public agency with needed equipment and strengthens the County's partnership with the City of Ceres. This action also supports the Board's priority of A Safe Community by enhancing investigative resources within Stanislaus County.

**RELEASE OF LIABILITY AGREEMENT FOR ACCEPTANCE OF K9 VEHICLE
FROM THE STANISLAUS COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT**

RECITALS

- A. The Stanislaus County Sheriff's Department uses K-9 vehicles to assist in providing law enforcement services to Stanislaus County residents.
- B. In 2007, the Stanislaus County Sheriff's Department acquired the 2007 Crown Victoria Police Interceptor with VIN number 2FAHP71WX7X119296 and internally identified as equipment number 07-06.
- C. The Stanislaus County Sheriff's Department has decided to declare vehicle 07-06 as surplus due to the vehicle surpassing the mileage retirement point of 100,000.

AGREEMENT

The undersigned hereby agree as follows:

- 1. Stanislaus County, acting through the Stanislaus County Sheriff's Department, releases custody, control and full title to a vehicle identified as 07-06, VIN number 2FAHP71WX7X119296, to the City of Ceres at no cost, and in sole consideration of the City of Ceres using vehicle 07-06 in the Public Safety Department, Emergency Services Division for use in their K-9 Accelerant Detection Program.
- 2. The City of Ceres will provide all necessary maintenance and care of vehicle 07-06 for the rest of its useful life.
- 3. The City of Ceres will not sell or trade vehicle 07-06.
- 4. The City of Ceres shall hold harmless and indemnify Stanislaus County and its officers, agents, and employees from any liability and/or claims arising out of vehicle 07-06, or the acts and/or omissions of any person in using or operating vehicle 07-06, from the date of this Agreement.
