SUBJECT:

Approval to Amend the Agreement for Professional Design Services with Quincy Engineering, Inc. for the Cooperstown Road over Gallup Creek Bridge Replacement Project

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

- 1. Approve Amendment No. 1 to the Professional Design Services Agreement for all-inclusive bridge engineering services with Quincy Engineering, Inc., in the amount of \$56,683 for a total not to exceed amount of \$428,288.36, for the Cooperstown Road over Gallup Creek Bridge Replacement Project.
- 2. Authorize the Director of Public Works to execute the amendment with Quincy Engineering, Inc., in the amount of \$56,683, and to sign necessary documents.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The Cooperstown Road over Gallup Creek Bridge Replacement Project is 100% funded by the Highway Bridge Program with toll credits in the amount of \$455,000. The amount is sufficient to fund the original contract amount of \$371,605.36 plus \$56,683 requested of Amendment No. 1. Funding is available in the current fiscal year's Public Works Road Projects budget.

Approval to Amend the Agreement for Professional Design Services with Quincy Engineering, Inc. for the Cooperstown Road over Gallup Creek Bridge Replacement Project

DISCUSSION:

On July 17, 2012, the Board of Supervisors approved a contract with Quincy Engineering, Inc., in the amount \$408,765.90. This amount includes a 10% contingency in the amount of \$37,160.54.

The project is currently at the 30% design stage and environmental clearance is being pursued in parallel. Environmental surveys and technical studies have been completed and due to the findings from the studies the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) is requiring additional studies to be performed.

The additional work to be performed will be as follow:

- 1. Extended Phase 1 Study (XP1) which will consist of five shovel test pits and two trenches (requiring excavation equipment). A revised Area of Potential Effect (APE) map will be required to depict the locations of the XP1 work. The intent of the study is to identify any cultural resources that may exist in the subsurface that is not visible at the surface.
- 2. Historical Resources Evaluation Report (HRER) will be required for two historical resources identified at the site.
- 3. Biological Assessment for the California Tiger Salamander.

Below is a breakdown of the costs associated with Amendment No. 1:

Due to findings from these studies as well as findings from previous studies at this location, Caltrans is requiring additional studies be performed. These additional studies include the following:

- Revised ASR/HPSR due to expanded APE Map and references to the HRER and Extended Phase 1 evaluation.
- Historical Resources Evaluation Report (HRER) for two historical resources.



Addendum 2 to Contract for Professional Services Dated August 8, 2012

Preamble

North State Resources, Inc. (NSR) has completed cultural and biological resources technical studies for the Cooperstown Road Bridge over Gallup Creek Project in accordance with our contract with Quincy Engineering, Inc. (QEI), dated August 8, 2012, and on behalf of Stanislaus County Department of Public Works (County). As a result of reviews by the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans), additional studies are needed to obtain regulatory approvals for the project. In addition, as a result of schedule delays and additional coordination with the project team, additional project management and meetings are necessary to allow NSR to continue providing environmental services for the project. To date, the schedule has been delayed by almost one year, and the remaining tasks are expected require about one additional work are provided below. Depending on the results of the additional studies, other documentation or technical support may be needed to support the regulatory compliance process; such additional work will be described in a subsequent addendum to our contract.

Changes to Scope of Work

This addendum modifies NSR's scope of work as follows and based on the assumptions noted below.

- We assume no project description changes or other changes will occur that would trigger revisions to existing reports (e.g., Natural Environment Study [NES], delineation report), other than what is described below.
- The Archaeological Survey Report and Historic Property Survey Report (ASR/HPSR) will need to be revised to reflect the changes made to the area of potential effects (APE) map and the additional cultural work that is needed.
- A new technical study for cultural resources is needed: a Historical Resources Evaluation Report (HRER).
- Due to the presence of cultural resources in the APE, an Extended Phase 1 evaluation will need to be completed, which includes test plots at strategic locations within the APE.
- A Biological Assessment (BA) is needed for California tiger salamander to support Section 7 consultations under the Endangered Species Act.

Changes to existing tasks and additions of new tasks are described below.

Task 7.1Program Management/Meetings

Modifications to Task 7.1 include additional management and accounting time over the two-year delay period and additional periodic conference calls and meetings during this period. Up to six (6) additional conference calls and two (2) in person meetings are being added to this task.

Task 7.6 Technical Studies

Subtask 7.6.3 Prepare Archaeological Survey Report/Historical Properties Survey Report

Task 7.6.3 is modified to include another revision to the existing ASR/HPSR. As a result of changes to the APE during Caltrans' reviews, the existing ASR/HPSR will need to be updated to reflect the following:

- Revised APE map
- Expanded survey coverage of entire APE based on fieldwork conducted for the HRER and Extended Phase 1 evaluation
- References to the new HRER and results of the Extended Phase 1 evaluation

NSR will revise the ASR/HPSR and submit it to QEI and the County for an initial review and for forwarding to Caltrans for final review.

Task 7.11 (New) Historical Resources Evaluation Report

Two historical resources (a segment of CA-STA-390H, Cooperstown Road, and a portion of CA-STA-394/H, Gallup Ranch) were documented within the area of direct impacts (ADI) during previous fieldwork in support of the ASR. These Gold Rush-era sites would be affected by ground-disturbing activities, including road and shoulder grading, the demolition of the existing bridge, and the construction of a new span. Caltrans has determined that these sites will need to be documented in an HRER. The HRER is used to document and evaluate for National Register of Historical Resources (NRHP) listing eligibility historic-era archaeological resources including built environment features and sites such as buildings, structures (e.g. remains of the Gallup Ranch), objects, districts, and linear features (e.g. Cooperstown Road).

NSR cultural resources specialists meeting the Secretary of the Interior's Standards and Caltrans standards for historical archaeology will develop a draft HRER. Due to the existing information on Cooperstown Road and the Gallup Ranch already provided by previous investigations and the ASR for the project, it is assumed that additional field documentation will not be necessary and that existing field data on the road and ranch location, configuration, and integrity will be sufficient for inclusion in the HRER. Supplemental archival research will be conducted, as necessary, to assist with the evaluation process.

NSR will submit an internal draft HRER to QEI and the County for an initial review and prepare a draft HRER for Caltrans' review. Comments from Caltrans will be addressed to produce a final HRER.

Task 7.12 (New) Extended Phase I Report

One occurrence of prehistoric materials (two small artifact scatters) was noted within the ADI as a result of a 1997 study (Napton et al. 1997). These scatters consist of several pieces of lithic debitage, a pestle fragment, and a biface. These artifacts were not visible and could not be re-recorded during NSR's 2013 survey of the APE. Other studies have also identified the potential for other prehistoric resources in the APE. In order to determine if any potentially significant (per NRHP criteria) prehistoric cultural resources are situated within the APE and specifically within the ADI, NSR will conduct an Extended Phase I study consisting of the excavation of five shovel test pits and two trenches (using a backhoe) at strategic locations within the APE. These test pits may need to be conducted with a Native American monitor present, and our cost estimate includes costs for one monitor for three 8-hour days. NSR assumes that any Native American community outreach along with any consultation or coordination with the State Historic Preservation Officer or other relevant agencies will be managed by Caltrans. If resources requiring additional analysis are discovered, they may need to be sent to a lab for testing and analysis, which is also included in our cost estimate.

The purpose of the Extended Phase I study is to determine if a prehistoric site is situated within the APE in subsurface contexts not visible during the previous surveys. NSR cultural resources specialists meeting the Secretary of the Interior's Standards and Caltrans standards for prehistoric archaeology will develop a draft Extended Phase I report. NSR will submit an internal draft Extended Phase I report to QEI and the County for an initial review and prepare a draft Extended Phase I report for Caltrans' review. Comments from Caltrans will be addressed to produce a final Extended Phase I report.

Task 7.13 (New)Biological Assessment

Based on the results of the NES prepared for the project, the project may affect the California tiger salamander. Caltrans has requested that a BA be prepared to discuss impacts to the species and support informal consultation with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS). NSR will prepare a BA using Caltrans' latest template and relying on the information and analyses presented in the NES. The BA will include the following sections: introduction, study methods, environmental setting, discussion of impacts and mitigation, conclusion and determination, and references. Additional details on the project may need to be obtained to refine the project description for purposes of the BA. We assume QEI will provide the additional details, to the extent they are available. No fieldwork is assumed to be necessary to prepare the BA.

NSR will submit an internal draft BA to QEI and the County for an initial review and prepare a draft BA for Caltrans' review. Comments from Caltrans will be addressed to produce a final BA for Caltrans' submittal to the USFWS. NSR will also coordinate with USFWS, as necessary, to assist the County and Caltrans with the required Endangered Species Act consultation process.

Revised Cost Estimate

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Per Addendum 1 to the contract, executed on March 11, 2014, an amount of \$4,400 from the original contract has not been allocated to specific work as a result of deobligating an optional task and was removed from our contract budget as part of the addendum. This available amount will be allocated to the tasks described in this addendum. NSR proposes to complete the tasks described above on a time and materials, not to exceed basis for a total of \$55,717, inclusive of the \$4,400. The budget includes labor, management, administration, and expenses. The new not-to-exceed amount for the contract will be \$124,950. The following table summarizes costs by task, and the spreadsheet on page 4 provides additional cost details.
