The purpose of this letter is to share information with you regarding changes that area taking place with the California State Council on Developmental Disabilities and the Area Boards on Developmental Disabilities. The changes were brought into California by last year's Assembly Bill (AB) 1595 which became effective to This law made changes to the Lanterman Act which governing the lisabilities system. Specifically, AB 1595 reposition oppointments to Area Position in the latter than the latter tha California into compliance with the federal Developmental Disabilities Assistance and Bill of Rights Act of 2000.

The major changes made by this law include:

- 1. The former Area Board offices are now Regional Offices of the State Council;
- 2. The former Area Boards are now Regional Advisory Committees to the State Council:
- 3. The Governor still appoints members to the State Council, but the Council itself is the appointing authority for the Regional Advisory Committees;
- 4. Area Board members who were serving on December 31, 2014 will continue to serve on the Regional Advisory Committees until their terms expire.
