DISCUSSION:

The Stanislaus County Equal Rights Commission is asking the Board of Supervisors to approve September 28, 2015 through October 11, 2015 as Diversity Awareness Weeks in Stanislaus County. This is the twelfth year Stanislaus County has celebrated diversity in conjunction with other local activities including the International Heritage Festival scheduled for October 3, 2015 at the Modesto Junior College's East Campus.

Departments throughout the County have organized activities and displays acknowledging, celebrating, and increasing awareness of the various diverse cultures that make our County a wonderful place to live. These Countywide events will also help us educate both employees and the public.

At 10th Street Place, the City of Modesto and Stanislaus County are partnering to celebrate the diversity that enriches us all with a Cultural Celebration event that will include informational booths, food trucks and live entertainment representing many of the cultures in our community on October 7, 2015 from 11:30 am – 1:30 pm in the Tenth Street Plaza.
