DISCUSSION:

The Public Works Department (Department) vehicles and equipment identified on the attached list (Attachment A) were fully depreciated by June 2011, and have since been retired from service due to a variety of condition issues, including expired compressed natural gas (CNG) tanks.

Vehicle manufacturers label CNG tanks with an expiration date in accordance with Natural Gas Vehicle (NGV) tank certification standards. Once CNG tanks reach the expiration date they cannot be recertified and must be taken out of service or replaced. For these reasons, the Department recommends the listed vehicles and equipment be declared as surplus and authorized for sale.

County Ordinance 2.24.065 allows for the sale of surplus property with a residual value greater than one-thousand dollars upon approval by the Board of Supervisors:

2.24.065 Sale of personal property.

The purchasing agent is authorized to sell, trade, trade in, lease, exchange, or otherwise dispose of any personal property belonging to the county which is deemed to be surplus and not required for public use by the county and which has a value of less than one thousand dollars per individual item without prior approval by the board of supervisors. Notwithstanding any other provision of this code, such disposition of surplus property may be made without securing bids or advertising. For disposition of personal property exceeding one thousand dollars per individual item, prior approval from the board of supervisors must be obtained. All proceeds from such sales shall be paid into the county treasury for the use of the county. (Ord. CS 475 §3, 1992).

The department is requesting to sell all the items on the attached spreadsheet in one of three ways: 1) release to an auction company, 2) online sale by government surplus auction website, or 3) County-managed surplus sale.

Auction companies charge a small fee to the County to pick-up on-off road vehicles, non-running vehicles and non-vehicular property. Whereas the use of online government surplus auctions, surplus remains with the County until sold online and the costs are borne by the buyer.

POLICY ISSUE:

The sale of poor condition vehicles and equipment is consistent with Board of Supervisors' priority of Efficient Delivery of Public Services. Funds generated by the sale of such equipment are returned to departmental budgets for use by departments.

STAFFING IMPACT:

Transfer of the vehicles and equipment to auction and associated paperwork will be completed by Public Works Morgan Shop and General Services Agency-Purchasing staff.
