STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. Conduct a Public Hearing on May 10, 2016 at 9:05 a.m. to introduce and waive the first reading of an ordinance to amend existing fees for the County Clerk-Recorder - Elections Division.

DISCUSSION:

The County Clerk-Recorder - Elections Division receives requests for information and services from candidates, political parties, officeholders, special districts, and the general public. The County Registrar of Voters is permitted by California law to charge a fee for the information and services provided. Fees currently being charged by the Elections Division have been adopted over time through Board Resolution. Elections fees were formally established by fee schedule in 1986 through Resolution #86-671. Amendments to the fee schedule were adopted in 1988 (Resolution #88-112), 1990 (Resolution #90-1555), and 1991 (Resolution #91-1699).

The Elections Division has chosen to compile the original schedule along with the separate amendments into one comprehensive Elections Division Fee Schedule (Attachment A). The County Clerk-Recorder - Elections Division also seeks to decrease two of those fees: (1) the "Printed Index/Walking List Charge per 1,000 Names" fee (previously identified under the "Printed Index" fee as a per name charge) to bring it into compliance with Elections Code Section 2184 (EC 2184) and (2) the "Voter Master File Export" fee to align more appropriately with costs realized through efficiencies attributed to computer technology advances. The proposed fee adjustments are detailed in the fee table below.

Methodology

The Printed Index/Walking List Charge per 1,000 Names fee is established in California Elections Code. EC 2184 states that county elections officials are to supply copies of the index at a charge of fifty cents (\$0.50) per thousand names. The current fee assessed in the County Clerk-Recorder - Elections office is \$1.50 per thousand names (listed in previous schedules as a per name charge of \$.0015). A decrease in this fee will bring the charge into compliance with the statute.

The Master Voter File Export information is provided by the Information Technology (IT) unit within the Elections Division and has traditionally been a cost-driven service. This type of information was previously housed on reel-to-reel tape and the process of providing copies for customers was time-consuming and costly. The information is now provided as a computer export designed to be imported into a database program and is less labor intensive than the previous process. The cost to provide the Master Voter File Export information to customers has decreased due to automation and increased efficiencies.

To determine the appropriate cost to provide this service, the Elections Division analyzed staff costs and the time required to perform the service. According to Government Code 54985, the fee or charge may reflect “the amount reasonably necessary to recover the cost of providing any product or service” and may include indirect costs. The Division also adjusted salary costs, eliminating non-allocable time for vacation, sick leave, standard breaks, and holidays from the hour factor used to calculate a productive hourly rate. This calculation resulted in a fully burdened cost per productive hour of \$153. Staff performing this task estimate that the average time required to provide the service is one hour, bringing the standard charge to \$153.

As an additional measure to ensure the fee is both reasonable and appropriate, the Division performed a seven county comparison study. The counties of Fresno, Kern, Kings, Madera, Merced, San Joaquin, and Tulare were polled regarding their respective charges to provide master voter file information to customers. The results of this study are presented in the Master Voter File Export table below, revealing a fee range of \$33 to \$200 and an average charge of \$154. The Division determined that the \$153 charge is reasonable and appropriate based on the calculation method and fair comparison to these seven counties.

Conclusion

County Clerk-Recorder - Elections Division management staff seeks to combine previously approved elections fees into one Elections Division Fee Schedule and to amend two fees in an effort to ensure reasonable and appropriate charges are applied to specific services. The Division reviewed current Elections Code and Government Code requirements to ensure compliance with the law and used a seven county comparison study to support in-house calculated costs. The results revealed that two fees should be decreased, as detailed above.

POLICY ISSUE:

Prior to levying a new fee or amending an existing fee, the County is required by Government Code Section 54985 et seq., to hold a scheduled public hearing as part of a regularly scheduled meeting of the Board of Supervisors. At that time, the Board may introduce and waive the first reading of an ordinance to amend existing fees of the County Clerk-Recorder – Elections Division. If approved, these fee changes will become effective on June 24, 2016.

FISCAL IMPACT:

If the elections fees are amended as requested, it is estimated that the Fiscal Year 2016-2017 revenue related to the changes would decrease by approximately \$1,000 and will have a negligible impact on the budget. This adjustment to elections fee revenue will be included in the Clerk-Recorder – Elections Division Fiscal Year 2016-2017 Proposed Budget.

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING EXISTING FEES
COLLECTED BY THE COUNTY
CLERK-RECORDER - ELECTIONS DIVISION**

THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF STANISLAUS, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Fees to be collected by the County Clerk-Recorder, Elections Division are amended as set forth in the County Clerk-Recorder – Elections Fee Schedule attached hereto as Attachment A and incorporated by reference, a copy of which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors and is available for public inspection and copying in that office in accordance with the California Public Records Act.

Section 2. 
