SUBJECT:

Approval to Declare Vehicles and Heavy Equipment as Surplus and Authorize the Sale

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

- 1. Declare the attached list of vehicles and heavy equipment as surplus and authorize sale.
- 2. Direct the Auditor/Controller to deposit proceeds from the disposal of Public Works vehicles and heavy equipment into account 5121-0042100-46000.

DISCUSSION:

The Public Works Department (Department) vehicles and equipment identified on the attached list (Attachment A) were depleted due to age and exceeded miles and hours. The majority of the Department vehicles and equipment were fully depreciated by May 2011, and have since been retired from service due to a variety of condition issues. For these reasons, the Department recommends the listed vehicles and equipment be declared as surplus and authorized for sale.

The department is requesting to sell all the items on the attached spreadsheet in one of three ways: 1) release to auction company, 2) online sale by government surplus auction website, or 3) County-managed surplus sale.

Auction companies charge a small fee to the County to pick-up on/off road vehicles, nonrunning vehicles, and non-vehicular property. Whereas the use of online government surplus auctions, surplus remains with the County until sold online and the costs are borne by the buyer.

POLICY ISSUE:

County Ordinance 2.24.065 allows for the sale of surplus property with a residual value greater than one-thousand dollars upon approval by the Board of Supervisors:

2.24.065 Sale of personal property.

The purchasing agent is authorized to sell, trade, trade in, lease, exchange, or otherwise dispose of any personal property belonging to the county which is deemed to be surplus and not required for public use by the county and which has a value of less than one thousand dollars per individual item without prior approval by the board of supervisors. Notwithstanding

any other provision of this code, such disposition of surplus property may be made without securing bids or advertising. For disposition of personal property exceeding one thousand dollars per individual item, prior approval from the board of supervisors must be obtained. All proceeds from such sales shall be paid into the county treasury for the use of the county. (Ord. CS 475 §3, 1992).

FISCAL IMPACT:

It is not known, at this time, what the proceeds of the auction will be. Based on previous sales of similar vehicles and heavy equipment, proceeds are estimated to total \$71,000. Proceeds will be returned to the Department of Public Works-Morgan Shop Division, account 5121-42100-46000.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS' PRIORITY:

The sale of poor condition vehicles and equipment is consistent with the Board of Supervisor priority of Efficient Delivery of Public Services.

STAFFING IMPACT:

Transfer of the vehicles and equipment to auction and associated paperwork will be completed by Public Works Morgan Shop and General Services Agency - Purchasing staff.
