SUBJECT:

Authorization to Apply for and Accept, if Awarded, the Public Transportation Modernization, Improvement, and Service Enhancement Account Program Residual Grant for Fiscal Years 2008-2009 and 2009-2010

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

- Authorize the Public Works Transit Division to apply for and accept, if awarded, the Public Transportation Modernization, Improvement, and Service Enhancement Account (PTMISEA) Program Residual Grant for \$119,894 from Fiscal Years 2008-2009 and 2009-2010.
- 2. Adopt a resolution authorizing the use of \$119,894 PTMISEA funding for safety and security improvements to the existing facility in Oakdale and authorize the Public Works Director, or designee, to act as Authorized Agent and execute all required documents and any amendments of the PTMISEA grant.

DISCUSSION:

In September of 2016, the Stanislaus Council of Governments (StanCOG) notified all County transit operators about the availability of residual PTMISEA funds totaling \$119,894 from Fiscal Year 2008-2009 and Fiscal Year 2009-2010 for implementation of transit capital projects. Subsequently, StanCOG requested project proposals from the transit operators for PTMISEA eligible transit related projects. In response to the request, the transit division submitted a project proposal to rehabilitate the existing county facility in the City of Oakdale to store transit buses used in the cities of Oakdale and Riverbank. Staff was notified in October 2016 that the County's project had been selected to receive the residual PTMISEA funds in the amount of \$119,894, and provide required project documentation to California Department of Transportation (CalTrans).

Currently, buses used for demand response service in the cities of Riverbank and Oakdale are stored in the County's contractor's facility in Modesto. In an effort to reduce mileage on the buses and to extend each vehicle's lifespan, staff began working with the County's contractor, Storer Transit, Inc., to consider using the county-owned Oakdale facility for bus parking. By using this facility, the daily roundtrip mileage for each bus would decrease from approximately 66 miles to approximately 20 miles. The Oakdale facility, previously used to store raw materials for road construction, does not have adequate security features, lighting or accessible plumbing. As a result, it was determined that further improvements were needed to safely utilize the facility for bus storage.

Authorization to Apply for and Accept, if Awarded, the Public Transportation Modernization, Improvement, and Service Enhancement Account Program Residual Grant for Fiscal Years 2008-2009 and 2009-2010

The proposed project consists of upgrading the existing manually locked swing gate to an automatic electrical gate and installing a modular restroom unit, which includes plumbing (sewer and water), and electrical work. The project also includes modernizing the existing lighting to improve and enhance safety and security of the facility. Additional work entails grading the site for drainage and installing asphalt pavement for bus parking.

The Public Works Transit division is an eligible recipient of PTMISEA transit capital grants and has received funds from the PTMISEA program since its inception in 2006. In November 2016, the Transit division submitted a funding allocation request to Caltrans for the amount of \$119,894. However, because this project is not identified in an approved Short Range Transit Plan as required by Caltrans, Caltrans has requested that the Stanislaus County governing board approve a resolution authorizing award of the residual PTMISEA funds for the project.

POLICY ISSUE:

CalTrans requires a formal resolution by the Board of Supervisors to approve the use of the residual PTMISEA amount of \$119,894 for the safety and security improvements to the existing facility.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The Department will return to the Board of Supervisors after the project bidding to award a construction contract, and, if needed, request an increase of appropriations during a regular budget cycle.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS' PRIORITY:

Approval of this action supports the Board's priority of A Well Planned Infrastructure System and Efficient Delivery of Public Services by providing for a public transit system that is compliant with Federal and State efficiency standards.

STAFFING IMPACT:

Existing Public Works staff will implement all phases of this project.
