

Approval to Introduce and Waive the First Reading of an Ordinance to Amend Section 11.08.020 of the Stanislaus County Code to extend the Existing Parking Prohibition on Sisk Road, North of Pirrone Road, in the Salida Area

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. Introduce and waive the first reading of an ordinance to amend Chapter 11.08.020, subsection 373, of the Stanislaus County Code to extend the existing parking prohibition on Sisk Road, north of Pirrone Road, in the Salida area.

DISCUSSION:

In the Fall of 2016, Great Valley Academy (GVA) purchased a portion of an existing school site in Salida that was not operating at its capacity. With the introduction of approximately 700 new GVA students to the school site on Sisk Road, north of Pirrone Road, student enrollment for the school site has increased creating a significant, and immediate, impact to the public roadway.

The current infrastructure on Sisk Road, north of Pirrone Road, does not support the full buildout capacity recommended for a larger school population and resulting traffic demand. After the school's opening, Public Works staff observed students and parents walking in the roadway, as well as vehicles making unsafe movements. This causes concerns for the health and safety of the public.

County staff, including the Planning Department, Public Works Department, and the Chief Executive Office, has been working with the new tenants of the school site to upgrade the public infrastructure, but it is recognized that such improvements will take time and additional finances.

To keep the public safe, staff is recommending an amendment to Section 11.08.020, subsection 373, of Stanislaus County to include that no parking will be allowed on both sides of Sisk Road from Pirrone Road to the end of County maintained roadway, approximately 2,650 feet north of said intersection. No parking signs will be installed on Sisk Road, north of Pirrone Road.

POLICY ISSUE:

California Vehicle Code 22507 requires Board of Supervisors' approval to amend parking zones.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The cost associated with installing the necessary signs on Sisk Road, north of Pirrone Road is approximately \$4,500 and will be paid for by the Highway Users Tax Account funds. Funding is available in the Approved Fiscal Year 2016-2017 Public Works Roads budget.

ORDINANCE

ORDINANCE NO. C.S. _____

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND PROHIBITED PARKING ON SISK ROAD

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Stanislaus, State of California, do ordain as follows:

Section 1. Chapter 11.08.020, subsection 373, of the Stanislaus County Code is amended to read as follows:

“373. Sisk Road. On both sides of Sisk Road from its intersection with Pirrone Road north to the end of the County maintained portion of the road.”

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days from and after the date of its passage and before the expiration of fifteen (15) days after its passage it shall be published once, with the names of the members voting for and against the same, in the Modesto Bee, a newspaper published in the County of Stanislaus, State of California.
