STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. Set a Public Hearing on May 9, 2017, at 9:05 a.m. to introduce and waive the first reading of an ordinance to amend existing fees for the Department of Environmental Resources

DISCUSSION:

The Department of Environmental Resources (Department) charges fees for services it provides in the program areas of Environmental Health, Hazardous Materials, Landfill, Code Enforcement, Solid Waste, and Milk and Dairy. State law mandates that fees charged for services cannot exceed actual costs and must be used to cover the costs of implementing the programs.

Annually, in preparation for the Proposed Budget, the Department evaluates the program costs and the fees associated with programs administered. This process includes the consideration of new or additional fees, where appropriate, as well as modifications to existing fees in order to cover the program costs. The recently conducted fee survey of comparable counties in the State found that the proposed fees, later mentioned in this report, are in line with other counties of comparable demographics.

This year the Department is proposing fee modifications to some of its programs, in addition to the Department's weighted labor rate (WLR), which impacts all programs and fee categories. If approved, these fee changes will correspond with Fiscal Year 2017-2018, and will become effective on June 23, 2017, with the exception of the landfill fee that would become effective on July 1, 2017. The proposed fee schedule is included as Attachment A and details regarding recommended fee modifications are as follows:

Hazardous Materials Fees

On January 1, 1997, Stanislaus County was certified by the California Environmental Protection Agency (Cal EPA) to be the Certified Unified Program Agency (CUPA) for all Stanislaus County. In its capacity as a CUPA, the County, by and through the Hazardous Materials Division of the Department of Environmental Services, administers the following programs, pursuant to the authorities granted by the California Health and Safety Code, Section 25404:

- Hazardous Materials Business Plan Program
- California Accidental Prevention Program
- Hazardous Waste Generator Program
- Tiered Permitting Program
- Underground Storage Tank (UST) Program
- Aboveground Petroleum Storage Tank (AGT) Program
- Medical Waste Management Program

CUPA staff spend the majority of their time inspecting facilities under the CUPA programs. Also, CUPA staff perform other non-inspection duties, such as: responding to complaints, emergency calls, providing training workshops, and conducting audits.

Based on staff's evaluation of the current CUPA fees versus projected expenses of the CUPA in the Fiscal Year 2016-2017, staff recommends a revision of the CUPA fees for the following programs:

- Underground Storage Tank (UST) Program
- Aboveground Petroleum Storage Tank (AGT) Program

Underground Storage Tank (UST) Program

Hazardous Materials staff is responsible for issuance of Underground Storage Tank (UST) permits for facilities that store hazardous materials in underground storage tanks. This requires the on-site inspections of all UST facilities within the county as well as reviewing facility submittals into the California Electronic Reporting System (CERS) data base for accuracy. The Board of Supervisors last amended the current UST Program fees in 2015.

Regulatory requirement changes, such as inspector training and certification, enhanced leak detection requirements, and the CERS implementation, have increased staff time within the program causing an increase in program costs.

The projected costs associated with implementing the program is \$295,475. In order to cover the increased cost to run the UST Program, staff is proposing to increase the per tank fee by 15%. This increase is consistent with many of our comparable counties. The projected revenue at the current fee is \$191,902, leaving a deficit of \$103,573. The proposed fee increase would produce additional estimated revenue of approximately \$9,405 for this program. Staff recommends gradually increasing the UST Program costs and fees over the next five years to fully cover the deficit.

Aboveground Petroleum Storage Tank Program

The Aboveground Petroleum Tank (AGT) Program regulates facilities that store 1,320 gallons (or greater) of petroleum products in aboveground tanks. Continuous inspector training, regulatory requirements changes, such as recent re-writing of the Aboveground Petroleum Storage Tank laws, and CERS reporting requirements, have increased staff time required within the program. The Board last approved the current Aboveground Petroleum Storage

Tank Program fees in 2016 by 10% and recognized that a gradual increase over time would be necessary to cover the deficit.

The projected costs associated with implementing the program is \$73,776. The projected revenue at the current fee is \$37,721, leaving a deficit of \$36,055. The staff recommendation is to increase the fees for this program by 10%. The proposed fees would produce additional estimated revenue of approximately \$4,125 for this program. Staff recommends gradually increasing the AGT Program costs and fees over the next five years to fully cover the deficit.

Milk and Dairy Program Fees

The County's Milk and Dairy Program is responsible for inspecting market milk ("Grade A") and manufacturing grade ("Grade B") dairy farms for conformance with quality and sanitation requirements. Routine samples of milk are analyzed for bacterial content and the presence of contaminants, to ensure compliance with standards for safety. Consumer complaints are investigated and appropriate action is taken for milk and milk products that may be unfit or unsafe for human consumption.

The Milk and Dairy Program increased fees 11.43% last year to reduce an \$80,000 deficit down to a \$26,000 deficit. Staff's recommendation is to gradually increase fees over the next few years to fully eliminate the deficit. Increased staff costs, laboratory costs and the further loss of dairies have increased the deficit. The current cost associated with implementing the program is \$413,000; this is a 4.3% increase over last year. A 9.23% fee increase in Grade A and Grade B dairies, and the increased weighted labor rate to \$111 would produce an additional \$33,362 in revenue. This would reduce the projected program deficit to approximately \$9,600.

The Milk and Dairy Program is recommending an increase in the dairy milk fees for Grade A and Grade B cow dairies, from \$.00975/gallon to \$.01065/gallon. The flat fees for Grade A goat and sheep dairies would raise from \$438.75/quarter to \$479.25/quarter, and Grade B goat and sheep dairies would raise from \$214.50/quarter to \$234.30/quarter. In addition to these recommended fee changes, the State-imposed 15% surcharge will also increase fees by \$71.89 for each Grade A dairy and \$35.15 to Grade B dairies.

Landfill Fees

Ash Tipping Fee

On June 26, 2012, the Board approved the Amended and Restated Service Agreement with Covanta Stanislaus, Inc., for the operation of the Waste-to-Energy facility. As a result, ash tipping fees were raised in Fiscal Year 2012-2013 by \$10 per ton. This increase was necessary in order to cover future ash monocell development/construction costs as well as the post-closure obligations at the Geer Road Landfill. Also included in the new Service Agreement was a clause that would escalate the tipping fee each July 1st based on the Consumer Price Index (CPI), "Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers, All items, West-Size B/C." The CPI will increase the ash tipping fee by 1.87% for Fiscal Year 2017-2018. This will

increase the current \$26.88 per ton tipping fee for ash to \$27.38 per ton. The estimated increase in revenue from this change will be approximately \$37,500.

Public Meetings

On March 6, 2017, the Department held two public meetings (Attachment B) to discuss the proposed amended fees. Information about the workshops was disseminated through the Department's normal dissemination process via email and postal service mailed to all parties affected or potentially affected by the fees. In addition, information regarding the proposed fee workshops was published in the Modesto Bee and the Department website. The overall feedback from the workshop participants was favorable to all the proposed amended fees.

POLICY ISSUE:

Prior to amending an existing fee, the County is required by Government Code Section 54985 et seq., to hold a scheduled public hearing as part of a regularly scheduled meeting of the Board of Supervisors. At that time the Board may introduce and waive the first reading of an ordinance to establish new and amend existing fees of the Department of Environmental Resources

FISCAL IMPACT:

If the proposed fee adjustments are approved, the increase in revenue for the Department of Environmental Resources is estimated to be \$84,392 in Fiscal Year 2017-2018. The recommended fee revenue will be included in the Department's Fiscal Year 2017-2018 Proposed Budget.
