#### SUBJECT:

Approval to Set a Public Hearing on May 9, 2017 at 9:05 a.m. to Introduce and Waive the First Reading of an Ordinance to Modify the Existing Intersystem Bus Transfer Fee for Stanislaus Regional Transit

#### STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

- 1. Set a public hearing on May 9, 2017 at 9:05 a.m. to introduce and waive the first reading of an ordinance to modify the existing intersystem bus transfer fee for Stanislaus Regional Transit (StaRT).
- 2. Direct the Clerk of the Board to publish the notice of public hearing in accordance with Government Code Section 66018.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

The Stanislaus County Public Works Transit division oversees transit operations in the County. As part of its responsibilities, the Transit division evaluates existing transit services and recommends changes to the fare structure as needed.

Annually, in preparation for the proposed Transit Division budget, staff evaluates transit operational costs and associated transit fares and fees to ensure compliance with Federal and State mandated requirements. This process includes reviewing new Federal Transit Administration (FTA) regulations as well as ensuring compliance with State mandated farebox recovery ratio requirement. To meet Federal and State requirements, the process includes consideration of new or additional fees, where appropriate, as well as modification to existing fees in order to cover increased operational costs.

For Fiscal Year (FY) 2017-2018, Stanislaus Regional Transit (StaRT) is proposing to charge an intersystem bus transfer fee of \$0.25 from StaRT to other transit agency fixed-route services. Currently, transfers are free to passengers from StaRT to another transit agency's fixed-route services. The proposed transfer fees, if adopted, will be equal to transfer fees currently charged by other transit operators in Stanislaus County, including Modesto Area Express (MAX), Ceres Area Transit (CAT), and Turlock Transit. This fee modification would assist with generating additional revenue and allow consistency among transit agency transfer fee processes.

## State Mandated Farebox Recovery Ratio

StaRT recommends charging an intersystem bus transfer fee to assist with meeting the State required farebox efficiency requirements. The farebox recovery ratio is mandated under the Transportation Development Act (TDA) which, under State legislation, provides funding for the County's public transit system. The TDA is comprised of two funding sources; Local Transportation Funds (LTF) and State Transit Assistance funds. The TDA legislation requires that transit agencies meet mandated farebox ratio set by the State for each transit operator that receives TDA funds. The farebox ratio is the ratio of fare revenues collected to operating expenses. Currently, the County's required farebox recovery ratio is 15%, which increased from 10% in FY 2016-2017 due to becoming a blended urban and rural transit farebox. Failure to maintain the 15% farebox ratio can result in the loss of LTF funding, the primary operating funds for StaRT.

Operating costs have increased at a greater rate than fare revenues. Under the current fare structure, StaRT will not meet the 15% farebox ratio in FY 2016-2017 due to increased operational costs, including fuel, insurance and labor. In addition to the increased fee revenue proposed in FY 2017-2018, StaRT is considering other strategies to assist in meeting the farebox ratio, such as service modifications that would decrease operational costs.

## Public Participation

As part of the public participation process implemented to solicit input from the public, information about the fee changes have been posted on StaRT's website (www.srt.org) and also placed on all transit buses and in local newspapers.

The proposed ordinance, if adopted, will become effective on August 21, 2017, to coincide with the StaRT annual service change. The last fare increase occurred in August 2016 but did not include the bus transfer fee. The existing and recommended fare structure is summarized in Attachment 1.

#### **POLICY ISSUE:**

The Board of Supervisors' approval of the proposed fare structure is required under Section 99400 of the Public Utility Code and complies with the FTA Half-Fare Policy under 49 U.S.C. Chapter 53; 49 CFR 609.23 and FTA C. 9030.1E.

Prior to establishing new fares, amending or eliminating existing fares, the County is required by Government Code Section 66018 et seq., to hold a public hearing as part of a regularly scheduled meeting of the Board of Supervisors.

#### **FISCAL IMPACT:**

Adopting the proposed ordinance will enable StaRT to increase estimated revenue by \$9,321 in FY 2017-2018, and will be included in the Public Works Transit Division Fiscal Year 2017-2018 Proposed Budget. This will support StaRT's strategy to achieve the required 15% farebox ratio implemented by the Stanislaus Council of Governments in FY 2016-2017.
