STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

 Adopt the Amended Conflict of Interest Code for the Stanislaus Consolidated Fire Protection District

DISCUSSION:

The Political Reform Act requires every local government agency to review its conflict of interest code on a biennial basis to determine if it is accurate or if amendments are needed. It is essential and legally required that an agency's conflict of interest code reflects the current structure of the agency and properly identifies all officials and employees who should be filing a Statement of Economic Interest (Form 700), and what financial interests they must disclose.

The County Board of Supervisors is the code reviewing body for county agencies and any other local government agency whose jurisdiction is determined to be solely within the county (e.g., school districts). An agency's amended code is not effective until it has been approved by the code reviewing body.

The Stanislaus Consolidated Fire Protection District has reviewed its conflict of interest code, and has submitted amendments to the Board of Supervisors for approval. County Counsel has reviewed the subject conflict of interest code in compliance with Government Code Section 87309 and has determined it meets the legal requirements.

POLICY ISSUE:

Stanislaus County Board of Supervisors is the code reviewing body for public agencies whose jurisdictions fall within Stanislaus County. An agency's amended conflict of interest code is not effective until it has been approved by the Board of Supervisors.

FISCAL IMPACT:

There is no fiscal impact associated with this item.

- Category 4: All investments and business positions in business entities, and sources of income, including gifts, loans and travel payments, that provide services, products, materials, machinery, vehicles or equipment of a type purchased or leased by the District.
- <u>Category 5</u>: All investments and business positions in business entities, and sources of income, including gifts, loans and travel payments, that provide services, products, materials, machinery, vehicles or equipment of a type purchased or leased by the designated employee's department, unit or division.

This Conflict of Interest Code does not require the reporting of gifts from outside this agency's jurisdiction if the source does not have some connection with or bearing upon the functions or duties of the position. (Reg. 18730.1)

RESOLUTION NO. 16-10

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE STANISLAUS CONSOLIDATED FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT TO AMEND THE CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE PURSUANT TO THE POLITICAL REFORM ACT OF 1974

WHEREAS, the State of California enacted the Political Reform Act of 1974, Government Code section 81000 et seq. (the "Act"), which contains provisions relating to conflicts of interest which potentially affect all officers, employees and consultants of the Stanislaus Consolidated Fire Protection District (the "District") and requires all public agencies to adopt and promulgate a conflict of interest code; and

• WHEREAS, the Board of Directors adopted a Conflict of Interest Code (the "Code") in compliance with the Act; and

WHEREAS, subsequent changed circumstances within the District have made it advisable and necessary pursuant to Sections 87306 and 87307 of the Act to amend and update the District's Code; and

WHEREAS, the potential penalties for violation of the provisions of the Act are substantial and may include criminal and civil liability, as well as equitable relief which could result in the District being restrained or prevented from acting in cases where the provisions of the Act may have been violated; and

WHEREAS, notice of the time and place of a public meeting on, and of consideration by the Board of Directors of, the proposed amended Code was provided each affected designated employee and publicly posted for review; and

WHEREAS, a public meeting was held upon the proposed amended Code at a regular meeting of the Board of Directors on December 8, 2016, at which all present were given an opportunity to be heard on the proposed amended Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Stanislaus Consolidated Fire Protection District that the Board of Directors does hereby adopt the proposed amended Conflict of Interest Code, a copy of which is attached hereto and shall be on file with the District Secretary of the Board and available to the public for inspection and copying during regular business hours;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the said amended Code shall be submitted to the County of Stanislaus Board of Supervisors for approval and said Code shall become effective immediately upon approval of the proposed amended Code.
