

SUBJECT:

Approval to Use Community Development Funds for Emergency Debris Removal at Grayson Road Bridge at the San Joaquin River

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. Approve the use of up to \$5,000 of Community Development Funds for Emergency Debris Removal at Grayson Road Bridge at the San Joaquin River.

DISCUSSION:

The Stanislaus County Community Development Fund was established by the Board of Supervisors in Fiscal Year 2007-2008 and has funded a variety of one-time projects benefiting the unincorporated area that demonstrate strong local support and commitment and a general public benefit. The Community Development Fund was established as a funding mechanism to assist in the promotion of activities that would enhance infrastructure and services in the unincorporated areas of Stanislaus County.

In February 2017, Supervisors Withrow and DeMartini received requests from the citizens of the Town of Grayson to remove debris along the Grayson Road Bridge. Debris from the Floods of '17 had accumulated in the channel and against the bridge. The debris was causing water to back up behind the bridge and to protect the bridge and upstream properties, Stanislaus County decided to clear the debris during the flood event. Removal of the debris helped increase flows within the old river channel and helped lower the river elevation upstream.

A local contractor was contacted with the appropriate equipment and a cost of \$2,500 per day was established for 2 operators and a long reach excavator. The debris was removed on February 21 and 22, 2017 with Public Works staff coordinating with the contractor to identify material to be removed. The cost of the debris removal will be funded from District 5 Community Development Fund.

POLICY ISSUE:

Board of Supervisors approval is required for the use of Community Development Funds.

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FISCAL IMPACT:

The total cost to contract the debris removal was \$5,000. The costs of the contractor will be funded by District 5 community development funds, which has a current balance of \$451,400.
