# We Believe in Stanislaus

## Partnering for Change

When Stanislaus Community Foundation created our organizational vision, we stated that Stanislaus becomes a 'community where people choose to live, work and thrive.' To achieve this vision, we articulated that our mission is 'to steward charitable resources and nurture partnerships' that advance our region.

While foundations around the country are experts at building philanthropic investments, Stanislaus Community Foundation has taken our partnerships just as seriously. We prioritize our relationships with donors, public agencies, nonprofit organizations, local residents, and civic leaders. 2016 was a year where we strengthened our partnerships to move our region forward.

## Championing Early Literacy

In partnership with the Stanislaus County Office of Education, the Children & Families Commission and the Stanislaus County Libraries, we continued to 'move the needle' around third grade reading levels with Stanislaus READS! We funded summer camps at pilot schools, supported family outreach through the Stanislaus Libraries, enrolled hundreds of kids in the Imagination Library free book program, and began to review data on kindergarten readiness thanks to a new common assessment tool.

## Strengthening Community Capacity

We hosted the third annual Connecting for Good event, once again drawing a sell-out crowd of neighborhood champions, public officials and business leaders. This time, Dave Viotti and his Smallify team immersed participants in an action-packed day of hands-on design labs. Thanks to the Prime Shine & Porges Family Foundation, we then provided four follow-up action labs for groups to work even closer with Viotti.

## Supporting College Attainment

Stanislaus Futures was launched in August in partnership with the Stanislaus County Office of Education, Stanislaus State, Modesto Junior College and seven pilot schools, along with our media partner, The Modesto Bee. Stanislaus Futures will provide more than \$350,000 in needs-based scholarships to low-income college-bound students while also aiming to align our K-12 and higher education systems to create a more educated local workforce.



## Investing in Local Leaders

We launched the Irvine New Leadership Network in the Fall of 2016, thanks to the James Irvine Foundation. The Irvine New Leadership Network is a two-year effort to equip emerging local leaders with the requisite tools to navigate increasingly complex systems, while simultaneously connecting them to a larger network of like-minded peers working across sectors.

## Building Philanthropy

We accomplished our leadership initiatives while building the long-term philanthropic assets of Stanislaus Community Foundation from \$16 million at the beginning of 2016 to over \$21 million by year-end. We disbursed over \$1.3 million in grants and scholarships to local agencies and students. These philanthropic investments were celebrated at two new signature events: an annual fundholder appreciation breakfast and a harvest dinner for local families.

In 2017, we commit to continued philanthropic investments in Stanislaus, while simultaneously supporting our partners to make meaningful change for all of our residents.

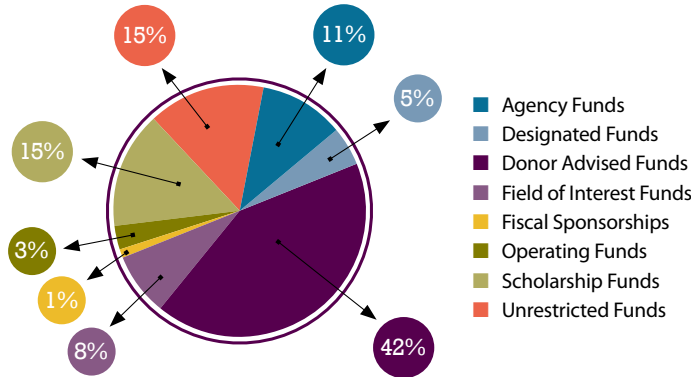

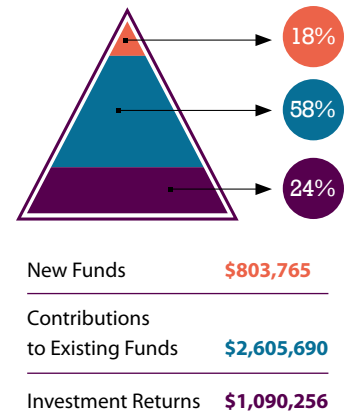
## 2016 Giving by Impact Area

# Building Community Through Leadership



## STANISLAUS READS!

71% of Stanislaus County third grade students do not read at grade-level standards, which is a major predictor of future success. Stanislaus Community Foundation is committed to moving the needle on third grade reading in Stanislaus County and continues to act as a lead backbone organization for Stanislaus READS!, a multi-agency, multi-year effort to help children read at grade-level standards by the end of third grade.



### Imagination Library

Stanislaus Community Foundation invested approximately \$20,000 to help expand the Imagination Library book program to pre-K children residing near Stanislaus READS! pilot schools. Over 750 children now receive a new book in their mailbox each month!

### Children's Book Drive

Stanislaus Community Foundation partnered with the Boy Scouts of America Greater Yosemite Council to help organize a county-wide Children's Book Drive as part of the Love Modesto event in April. 120 local troops worked with residents and businesses to collect children's books. Nearly 7,000 children's books were collected, sorted, and redistributed to Stanislaus READS! pilot schools and outreach partners.

### Family Outreach

Stanislaus Community Foundation funded the Stanislaus County Library and Congregations Building Community to provide culturally-sensitive early literacy outreach to families where they 'eat, work, and pray.' Our outreach partners provided over 50 presentations to 3,500 family members at local businesses, churches, parks, and community centers. Thanks to the support and donations of food and books from multiple organizations like Cost Less, the Modesto Fire Department and the Boy Scouts of America, parent participation at Burbank Elementary School's 2016 open house more than tripled compared to previous open houses.



### Summer Learning

Stanislaus Community Foundation invested over \$50,000 into summer learning camps at six Stanislaus READS! pilot schools. Over 750 children participated in the summer programs; each site offering unique enrichment opportunities from Lego robotics, Iron Chef cooking demonstrations, field trips to the library and Monterey Bay Aquarium, student drama productions, Great Valley Museum presentations, and music appreciation.

### Strategic Planning

In addition to logistical support, Stanislaus Community Foundation realizes that a multi-year, multi-stakeholder initiative is complex by nature and never static. Strategies evolve over time, people change roles, and priorities change. To help navigate this complexity, in 2016 Stanislaus Community Foundation invested in a strategic planning process with the initiative steering committee and school district partners to determine the long-term direction for Stanislaus READS!



## STANISLAUS FUTURES



As a twin effort to Stanislaus READS!, on the other end of the 'cradle to career' pipeline, Stanislaus Community

Foundation launched Stanislaus Futures in August 2016. This initiative is a multi-year, multi-agency initiative to change the college-going culture in our community.

Growing the number of students who earn college degrees and obtain well-paying jobs makes a bright future for Stanislaus County. But right now, we're falling behind. Out of every 100 ninth graders in Stanislaus County, 84 will graduate from high school, but only 19 will complete college within six years. Many local students have the ability and desire to succeed in college, but lack the guidance and financial resources.

With support from the statewide College Futures Foundation and our media partner The Modesto Bee, Stanislaus Community Foundation has brought together six high school districts, the Stanislaus County Office of Education (SCOE), Modesto Junior College and CSU Stanislaus to focus on three areas:

**ACCESS** In partnership with the SCOE and local high schools, Stanislaus Community Foundation is funding culturally-sensitive outreach to low-income students and their parents where they live, work and pray so they know their college and financial aid options.

**ATTAIN** Stanislaus Community Foundation will provide over \$300,000 in strategic, needs-based scholarships to graduating seniors in 2017 and 2018, while simultaneously building local scholarship funds with private and corporate donors. Each scholarship amount is "last dollar in" to close the gap between what financial aid has been awarded and what is still needed to help a student meet college costs.

**ALIGN** With the help of Stanford's John Gardner Center for Youth & Communities, Stanislaus Community Foundation is working with high school districts and institutions of higher education to address high school-to-college transition points and other key opportunities not currently addressed among education systems. Math emerged as one of the major bottlenecks in the transition. Moving forward, the Stanislaus Futures partners will focus on math achievement, college readiness and student transitions between systems.

## IRVINE NEW LEADERSHIP NETWORK

Stanislaus Community Foundation launched the Irvine New Leadership Network in the Fall of 2016, thanks to the James Irvine Foundation. The Irvine New Leadership Network is a two-year effort to equip emerging local leaders with the requisite tools to navigate increasingly complex systems, while simultaneously connecting them to a larger network of like-minded peers working across sectors.

The New Leadership Network invests in leaders from business, government, education and nonprofits who are already doing great work. By convening four cohorts intensively over a six-month period in the next two years, the network will give leaders an opportunity to connect to one another and expand their 21st century leadership skills around innovation, design and collaboration.

Close to 300 people attended Stanislaus Community Foundation's annual Connecting for Good event at Modesto Centre Plaza on April 28, 2016 to participate in a unique program that equipped them with real tools to build up their capacity for local change work. The event featured Dave Viotti and the Smallify Rapid Innovation Lab – a hands-on lab that focuses on moving from idea to action. Thanks to the Prime Shine & Porges Family Foundation, Stanislaus Community Foundation then provided four follow-up action labs for groups to work even closer with Viotti.

## YOU CAN GIVE TO A FUND OR ESTABLISH YOUR OWN

### TYPES OF FUNDS:

- **Donor Advised Funds** are initiated by individuals, families and corporations. These funds are broad in their charitable interest and impact a wide scope of local needs based on the donor's choice of nonprofit organizations.
- **Scholarship Funds** are set up by various donors; including booster clubs, professional groups, families, churches and companies; to invest in local students. The criteria vary for each of our scholarships. Stanislaus Community Foundation manages the online application process and our scholarship committee evaluates applications and selects final recipients per the criteria established by donors.
- **Field-of-Interest and Designated Funds** are more specific and support certain philanthropic interests or are designated to fund specific nonprofit agencies and programs.
- **Agency Funds** are either endowed or expendable, and are developed by agencies that see the wisdom of ensuring long-term investment growth in working with Stanislaus Community Foundation.
- **Unrestricted Funds** allow Stanislaus Community Foundation to respond to the community's changing needs over time.
