Dear Ms. King:

At their meeting on September 11, 2017, the Oakdale Joint Unified School District Board of Trustees adopted the enclosed Resolution #17-08-03, Consolidation of Future Governing Board Member Elections with the Statewide General Election in order to change from odd-year elections to even-year elections. The District Board adopted this Resolution in order to save public funds, provide greater voter input and participation into school Board elections, and avoid any potential liability under the California Voter Participation Act (commencing with Election Code section 14050 and following).

Under California Elections Code section 10404.5, the District adopted the Resolution to change their election dates from November of odd-numbered years to the statewide direct primary of even-numbered years. If the change in election date is approved, the November 2019 Governing Board election date will be moved to the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November 2020 and the November 2021 Governing Board election date will be moved to the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November 2022. The terms of Governing Board members which would have expired in 2019 and 2021 will be extended by one (1) year. Election Code § 10404.5(g). (See Appendix A)

Under the proposed rescheduled election cycle, Governing Board member elections held in 2015 and 2017 will be extended to a five (5) year term. Subsequent Governing Board member elections in 2020 and 2022 will be for a four (4) year term.

WHEREAS, Elections Code section 1302(b) authorizes the District to change the election date for its Governing Board members by adopting a resolution for consolidation of election and seeking approval of the change by the Board of Supervisors of the affected county in accordance with Elections Code section 10404.5; and

WHEREAS, if the change in election date is approved, the November 2019 District election date will be moved to the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November 2020, with the terms of Governing Board members which would have expired in December 2019 being extended to December 2020 and the terms of Governing Board members which would have expired in December 2021 being extended to December 2022 [Elec. Code, § 10404.5(g)].

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Governing Board of the District adopts this Resolution to consolidate the election date for members of the Governing Board with the date for the California general election held in November of even-numbered years [Elec. Code, § 1001] pursuant to Elections Code section 1302(b).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Superintendent, or designee, is directed to submit this Resolution to the Stanislaus and San Joaquin County Boards of Supervisors explaining the rationale for the Resolution and requesting formal approval of the change by the Boards of Supervisors at a public meeting within sixty (60) days after submission, and after the Resolution has been posted in public places.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if the request for consolidation of election is approved by the Stanislaus and San Joaquin County Boards of Supervisors, the District recognizes its obligation to pay the expense of mailing the notice of approval of the change in election date by the Stanislaus and San Joaquin County Boards of Supervisors as required by Elections Code section 10404.5(e).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if the request for consolidation of election is approved by the Stanislaus and San Joaquin County Boards of Supervisors, the date of the next scheduled Governing Board election in November 2019 shall be moved to the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November 2020 and each subsequent Board member election shall be held two (2) years thereafter in November of even numbered years in conjunction with the statewide general election.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if the request for consolidation of election is approved, the term of office of current Governing Board members expiring in November 2019 shall be extended to November 2020 and the term of Governing Board members expiring in November 2021 shall be extended to November 2022.





Dear Supervisors:

Please be advised that the Knights Ferry Elementary School District ("District") at a regular meeting held Thursday, September 14, 2017, voted to change its governing board member election schedule from odd-numbered years to even-numbered years.

Pursuant to Elections Code section 10404.5, the District hereby submits a copy of the District's resolution along with this formal request to the County Board of Supervisors to approve the change sought by the District.

Under Elections Code section 10404.5(d)(1), the County Board of Supervisors shall approve the resolution within 60 (sixty) days of receiving the request unless it finds that the ballot style, voting equipment, or computer capacity is such that additional elections or materials cannot be handled.

The District seeks to consolidate its election with the statewide general election for several reasons. First, voter turnout is generally greater for statewide general elections than for special local elections including school board member elections. Second, there is a potential cost savings to the District for consolidating. Third, the District wishes to avoid any potential liability resulting from the recently enacted California Voter Participation Rights Act as a result of maintaining elections in odd-numbered years.

Currently, there is insufficient time to change the District's election method in advance of the November 2017 election.



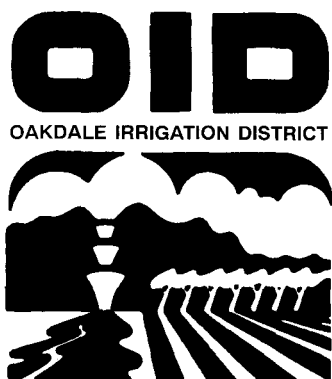

Dear Ms. King:

The Oakdale Irrigation District (“District”) adopted Resolution No. 2017-71 at their Board Meeting on September 19, 2017 to Consolidate the Board of Directors’ Elections from Odd-Numbered Years to Even-Numbered Years to be Held with the General Elections.

The District adopted this resolution to save public funds, provide greater voter input and participation in the special district’s elections, and avoid any potential liability under the California Voter Participation Act (commencing with Election Code §14050, et seq.).

Under Elections Code §10404, the District adopted Resolution No. 2017-71 to consolidate the election date for the Directors of the Board with the date for the California general election in November in even numbered years. The Resolution requests the Board of Supervisors to approve the date of the election for Divisions 1 and 4 to the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November of 2020 which would normally have expired in 2019; and the date of the election for Divisions 2, 3, and 5 to the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November of 2022, which would normally have expired in 2021. This is more fully set forth in Appendix “A” to Resolution No. 2017-71. Elections Code §10404(e) states that the Board of Supervisors, within sixty (60) days from the date of submission, shall approve the resolution unless it finds that the ballot style, voting equipment, or computer capacity is such that additional elections or materials cannot be handled.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
RESOLUTION CONSOLIDATING THE BOARD OF
DIRECTORS' ELECTIONS FROM ODD-NUMBERED YEARS
TO EVEN-NUMBERED YEARS TO BE HELD WITH
THE GENERAL ELECTIONS

WHEREAS, the Oakdale Irrigation District ("District") currently conducts Board elections on odd-numbered years pursuant to the Elections Code §10505(a); and

WHEREAS, statewide general elections are held in California only in June and November of even-number years (Elections Code §1001); and

WHEREAS, the District is located within Stanislaus and San Joaquin Counties; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Elections Code §10404(h), if a special district is located in more than one county, the special district may not consolidate an election if any county in which the special district is located denies the request for consolidation;

WHEREAS, generally voter turnout is greater for statewide general elections than for local elections, including special districts elections held in November of odd-numbered years; and

WHEREAS, California Senate Bill 415 an act (which may be cited to as the California Voter Participation Rights Act (herein "the Act")) to add Chapter 1.7 (commencing with Section 14050) to Division 14 of the Elections Code, was approved by the California Governor and filed with the Secretary of State on September 1, 2015; and

WHEREAS, commencing January 1, 2018, the Act prohibits a political subdivision from holding an election other than on a statewide election date (i.e. "off-cycle") if holding an election on a non-concurrent date has previously resulted in voter turnout for a regularly scheduled election in the political subdivision being at least 25% less than the average voter turnout within the political subdivision for the four previous statewide general elections; and

WHEREAS, a political subdivision, may however, hold an off-cycle election if, by January 1, 2018, the political subdivision has adopted a plan to consolidate future elections with the statewide elections no later than the November 8, 2022 statewide general election; and

WHEREAS, the Act authorizes attorneys' fees to a prevailing plaintiff who successfully files an action in Superior Court to enforce the Act's prohibition; and

WHEREAS, the District may achieve a savings in the cost of its elections, if the District's elections are consolidated with the statewide general elections; and

WHEREAS, as a result of these facts, the Board desires to change the date of future board member elections to be consolidated with the California statewide general election in order to avoid potential litigation, save public funds and provide greater voter input to special district elections.

WHEREAS, Elections Code §10404 establishes a procedure whereby the special district may change the election date for its board members by adopting a resolution seeking approval of the change by the Board of Supervisors in Stanislaus and San Joaquin Counties; and

WHEREAS, if this change in election date is approved, it is requested that the new election date for Divisions 1 and 4 be moved from the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November 2019 to the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November of 2020 and that the election date for Divisions 2, 3, and 5 be moved from the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November of 2021 to the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November 2022 (refer to Appendix A); and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Oakdale Irrigation District Board of Directors hereby finds, determines and/or declares, as follows:

1. The Board of Directors declares its intent to adopt this resolution to consolidate the election date for the Directors of the Board with the date for the California general election in November in even-numbered years pursuant to Elections Code §10404.

2. The District will forward this resolution to the Stanislaus County and San Joaquin County Board of Supervisors explaining the rationale for the resolution and requesting formal approval of the change by the Board of Supervisors at a public meeting held within 60 days after submission and after the resolution has been posted in accordance with the law.

3. The District will notify the Stanislaus and the San Joaquin County Elections Office that the District is prepared to pay the expense of mailing notice of approval of the change in election by the Stanislaus County and San Joaquin County Board of Supervisors as required by Elections Code §10404(f).


4. If consolidation of election is approved by the Boards of Supervisors, the date of that election for Divisions 1 and 4 will be moved to the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November of 2020 and that the date of election for Divisions 2, 3, and 5 will be moved to the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November 2022.


