#### SUBJECT:

Approval to Proceed with a Safety Renovation Project at the Existing Minimum Housing Visitation Location at the Public Safety Center and Approval to Issue a Notice Inviting Bids and Related Actions

#### **STAFF RECOMMENDATION:**

- 1. Approve proceeding with a Safety Renovation Project at the existing Minimum Housing Visitation Location at the Public Safety Center using existing budgeted funds.
- 2. Approve the Plans and Specifications for the project and authorize the Chief Operations Officer, acting as the Project Manager to issue a Notice Inviting Bids for the project, set a bid date and modify the bid date if necessary.
- 3. Authorize the Project Manager to award a construction contract to the lowest responsive bidder, as long as it is within the approved project budget.
- 4. Authorize the Project Manager to negotiate and sign contracts, work authorizations, and purchase orders for professional services needed in the bid and award phase of the project as long as they are within the approved project budget.
- 5. Direct the Auditor-Controller to establish a new project budget of \$250,000 utilizing funds in the Honor Farm Replacement Project and Honor Farm Insurance Proceeds, as outlined in the budget journal form.
- 6. Authorize the Project Manager to negotiate and sign change orders up to \$25,000, consistent with the County's Change Order Policy, as long as they are within the previously approved project budget.

# DISCUSSION:

As the Public Safety Center facilities have been modernized, these particular facilities built in 1994 are in need of a security upgrade for the visitation program. The Sheriff's Department completed a needs assessment of the visitation room in the Minimum Housing Unit particularly in light of security needs and incidents from other detention centers. The existing space is considered a public area and for that reason a plan has been developed to increase the level of safety and security for staff, inmates and family members within the Minimum Security Housing Visiting facility. This assessment led to the recommendation that a safety renovation project is needed to to enhance the barrier between staff and visitors.

The current configuration of the visitation area is an open lobby where visitors enter through a secure door. Once this door is opened, there is no control of the public, nor is there any type of safety protective barrier other than a regular office counter to protect the Deputy working. The proposed renovation will create a safer work space for the Deputies assigned to the facility.

On June 1, 2017, the Chief Operations Officer hired Pires, Lipomi & Navarro Architectural Corporation to develop plans and specifications for this project. The proposed changes consist of a secure ballistic floor to ceiling enclosure of the Deputy station and creating a secured, controlled entryway. When visitors come through the entrance, they will enter into the enclosed secure corridor, where they will then secure belongings, pass through a metal detector, and then move to a second secured doorway, which will be unlocked electronically. Once through the initial secure area, visitors will then move to an enclosed secured Deputy station where they will sign in, allowing better protection for staff and the public.

The provision of required visiting will not be impacted by construction.

#### POLICY ISSUE:

The Board of Supervisors has the authority to approve new project plans and specifications and to transfer funds within the County's budget.

# FISCAL IMPACT:

This project will be an informally bid project with construction estimated at \$175,000 or less. Additional project soft costs, including project administration are estimated to be \$75,000 for a total project cost not to exceed \$250,000.

If approved, this project will be paid for using funds received from the Honor Farm insurance settlement. As of Fiscal Period December 2017, there is a total of approximately \$689,000 fund balance available in the Honor Farm Replacement Project funds. Of this total, \$155,000 will be used from CEO Honor Farm Barracks 1, 2 Proceeds and \$95,000 will be used from CEO Honor Farm Barracks Replacement Project for this safety improvement.

#### BOARD OF SUPERVISORS' PRIORITY:

The recommended action is consistent with the Board of Supervisors' priority of *Delivering Efficient Public Services, Sustainable Resources and Infrastructure* by ensuring the safety of visitors and staff at the Public Safety Center Minimum Housing Unit.

# **STAFFING IMPACT:**

This project will be successfully executed by existing Capital Projects staff in collaboration with the Sheriff's Office.
