SUBJECT:

Approval of a Contract with the California Department of Public Health Services for the Continuation of the Immunization Assistance Program for the Period of July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2022

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

- Approve Contract #17-10356 with the California Department of Public Health Services for the continuation of the Immunization Assistance Program for the period of July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2022.
- 2. Authorize the Health Services Agency's Managing Director, or her designee, to sign and execute the contract and any subsequent contracts or amendments thereafter.

DISCUSSION:

The Immunization Assistance Program (IAP) grant in the amount of \$929,255 for the period July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2022, is a continuation of an existing grant from the State of California Department of Public Health. The amount payable for Fiscal Years 2017-2018 and 2018-2019 will not exceed \$185,851 annually.

During Fiscal Year 2016-2017, the Health Services Agency, Public Health (HSA PH) Division administered approximately 15,172 immunizations to Stanislaus County residents. Additionally, there were approximately 1,661 flu vaccinations administered by HSA PH. This grant assists the HSA PH to provide monitoring of school immunization records, vaccine management, education and outreach, as well as Perinatal Hepatitis B case management. Additionally, this grant provides support for leading campaigns to encourage vaccination for flu, back to school, and toddler immunizations; working with community partners to encourage participation in the Immunization Registry; and coordinate vaccine education and trainings for community providers.

Statewide Child Care, Kindergarten and 7th grade assessment surveys were conducted in fiscal years 2016-2017 prepared by the California Department of Public Health to evaluate the immunization status of California children. According to the surveys, 94% of Stanislaus county children at the time of enrollment into Kindergarten were fully immunized and 95% of 7th graders received the vaccination for tetanus, diphtheria, and pertussis (Tdap); although specific schools within the county have rates less than 90%

of students fully vaccinated. Children who miss immunizations are more likely to suffer from illness, disability or even death from diseases that can be prevented. This funding source assists the agency in focusing efforts to address the immunization status of the 0-18 age group.

In accordance with existing law (effective January 1, 2016), parents or guardians of students in any school or child care facility, whether public or private, are no longer allowed to submit a personal beliefs exemption to a currently required vaccine. HSA PH plays a critical role in educating the public and providing education and guidance to schools for implementation.

POLICY ISSUE:

Board of Supervisors' approval is required in order to sign this multi-year contract for \$929,255 with the California Department of Public Health. Approval will enable the Health Services Agency to continue immunization outreach programs, Perinatal Hepatitis B case management and related immunization programs, which decrease the risk of childhood illnesses prevented through immunization.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The HSA PH Division Approved Final Budget for Fiscal Year 2017-2018 is \$26.05 million. Funding relative to the proposed contract was included in the Budget. The term of this Agreement is from July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2022, and will provide the HSA PH \$929,255 over the five-year period.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS' PRIORITY:

The recommended actions are consistent with the Boards' priority of *Supporting Community Health* by promoting prevention and access to medically necessary services.

STAFFING IMPACT:

There is no staffing impact associated with this request, as existing staff will perform duties in the scope of work.

CALIFORNIA IMMUNIZATION PROGRAM RFA # 17-10072 Immunization Local Assistance Grant Awarded By

THE CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH, hereinafter "Department"

TO

Stanislaus County Health Services Agency, hereinafter "Grantee"

Implementing the project, "To assist local health departments (LHDs) in preventing and controlling vaccine-preventable diseases (VPDs) in the local health jurisdiction (LHJ)," hereinafter "Project"

GRANT AGREEMENT NUMBER 17–10356

The Department awards this Grant and the Grantee accepts and agrees to use the Grant funds as follows:

AUTHORITY: The Department has authority to grant funds for the Project under Health and Safety Code, Section 120325-120380 of the Health & Safety Code, which requires immunizations against childhood diseases prior to school admittance and Federal Grant number 5NH23IP000717-05-00.

PURPOSE: The Department shall provide a grant to and for the benefit of the Grantee; the purpose of the Grant is to assist LHDs in preventing and controlling VPDs in the LHJ. The Grantee is to implement activities to:

- Assess and improve coverage levels in the jurisdiction of all vaccines recommended by the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) to protect the population.
- Detect, report, and control vaccine-preventable diseases in the jurisdiction.

Related Statntes

California Health & Safety Code sections:

- 120130 requires the Local Health Officers to properly report to CDPH those diseases listed as reportable, which include vaccine-preventable diseases.
- 120175 requires the Local Health Officers to take measures as may be necessary to prevent the spread or occurrence of additional cases of reportable diseases (which includes reportable vaccine-preventable diseases).
- 120350 requires Local Health Officers to organize and maintain a program to make available the immunizations required for admittance to child care facilities and schools.

GRANT AMOUNT: The maximum amount payable under this Grant shall not exceed Nine Hundred Twenty-Nine Thousand Two Hundred Fifty-Five dollars (\$929,255).

TERM OF GRANT: The term of the Grant shall begin on July 1, 2017, and terminates on June 30, 2022. No funds may be requested or invoiced for work performed or costs incurred after June 30, 2022.
