SUBJECT:

Approval of Fiscal Year 2018-2019 Contract Renewals with the California Department of Education for the Administration of the Child Care and Development Block Grants

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

1. Approve the renewal of two contracts with the California Department of Education (CDE) for administration of Child Care and Development Block Grants.
2. Authorize the Community Services Agency Director, or her designee, to sign the contracts that are included in this agenda item and any subsequent amendments to add services and payments for services.

DISCUSSION:

Effective January 1, 1998, the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act consolidated all former Aid to Families with Dependent Children (AFDC) related Child Care programs into a new three-stage Child Care system in order to serve current and former recipients of Temporary Aid to Needy Families (TANF).

Eligibility for Stage 1 Child Care occurs when a parent enters CalWORKs (California's cash assistance program) and is working or starting Welfare to Work activities. Stage 1 funding is administered by the California Department of Social Services and is part of the CalWORKs allocation. Eligible families then transition from Stage 1 Child Care to Stage 2 Child Care once they become "stable". A family is considered to be "stable" when a Child Care provider has been selected, all paper work has been completed and the recipient is either working or participating in Welfare to Work activities.

Child Care funding for Stages 2 and 3 is administered by the California Department of Education (CDE). CDE Child Care Stages 2 and 3 funding is used to assist CalWORKs families who are transitioning off cash aid and CalWORKs families who have transitioned off cash aid by allowing them to remain employed and off cash assistance. In order for current CalWORKs families to remain eligible for Stage 2 and 3 Child Care, they must be working or participating in Welfare to Work activities and have children who meet specific age requirements. In order for former CalWORKs families to remain eligible for Stage 2 and Stage 3 Child Care, they must be working or meeting a criteria of need, be within certain income limits and have children who meet specific age requirements.

The Community Services Agency receives program contracts from CDE to fund Stages 2 and 3 Child Care. The Agency administers these Alternative Payment programs, and generates reimbursements for eligible families directly to the Child Care providers. The Agency submits monthly claims to the CDE for reimbursement of funds.

A family can remain in Stage 2 Child Care while working or participating in Welfare to Work activities for up to 24 months from cash aid discontinuance. After a family has reached the end of their 24-month Stage 2 time-limit, if there is sufficient funding available they transition to Stage 3 Child Care. As of April 2018, an average of 775 children per month participated in Stage 2 Child Care and 301 children in Stage 3 Child Care.

Families funded through Stage 3 funds can continue to receive services until either the family's income exceeds the program limits, or at the end of the recertification period in which all children reach the age of 13 years.

These two contracts totaling \$6,079,956 will allow the Agency to provide Child Care services to approximately 1,242 children each month.

The California Department of Education based the contract amounts on the Governor's May Revise funding levels. The CDE is analyzing the legislation of the June 2018 passage of the Fiscal Year 2018-2019 State budget. At this time, it is unknown if the analysis will result in contract amendments to adjust funding.

Renewal of the CDE contracts for Stages 2 and 3 will provide Child Care services to children whose parents are transitioning off or have transitioned off CalWORKs.

The Agency recommends accepting these two CDE Child Care and Development Alternative Payment contracts effective July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019.

POLICY ISSUE:

CDE requires CSA to obtain Board of Supervisors approval of the Stage 2 and 3 Child Care and Development Alternative Payment contracts.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The annual amount of these two California Department of Education (CDE) contracts for Fiscal Year 2018-2019 is \$6,079,956. Estimated revenues and appropriations for direct services are included in the Community Services Agency's 2018-2019 Adopted Proposed Budget in the amount of \$5,841,887 and \$4,919,546, respectively. This amount was based on budget projections; as actual contract amounts were not available at that time. The budget amount will be right sized to the contract amount of \$6,079,956 during the 2018-2019 Mid-Year Budget. The Child Care Programs are

100% Federal and State funded. There is no cost to the General Fund for the CDE Child Care contracts.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS' PRIORITY:

The recommended actions are consistent with the Boards' priority of *Supporting Community Health and Delivering Efficient Public Services and Community Infrastructure* by providing payments for Child Care services received by working and low-income recipient families at risk of becoming dependent on public assistance.

STAFFING IMPACT:

Existing Community Services Agency staff are available to support these Fiscal Year 2018-2019 CDE child care contracts at current service levels. In the future, should the service level demand increase, the Agency will analyze available options and return to the Board of Supervisors for consideration of any necessary staffing changes.

LOCAL AGREEMENT FOR CHILD DEVELOPMENT SERVICES

CONTRACTOR'S NAME: STANISLAUS COUNTY COMMUNITY SERVICES AGENCY

This Agreement is entered into between the State Agency and the Contractor named above. The Contractor agrees to comply with the CONTINUED FUNDING APPLICATION FY 18-19; the GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS (GTC 04/2017)*; the CalWORKs STAGE 2 PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS*, and the FUNDING TERMS AND CONDITIONS (FT&C)*, which are by this reference made a part of this Agreement. Where the GTC 04/2017 conflicts with either the Program Requirements or the FT&C, the Program Requirements or the FT&C will prevail.

Funding of this Agreement is contingent upon appropriation and availability of sufficient funds. This Agreement may be terminated immediately by the State if funds are not appropriated or available in amounts sufficient to fund the State's obligations under this Agreement.

The period of performance for this Agreement is July 01, 2018 through June 30, 2019. For satisfactory performance of the required services, the Contractor shall be reimbursed in accordance with the Determination of Reimbursable Amount section of the FT&C, for the Maximum Reimbursable Amount (MRA) of \$4,221,895.00.





CONTRACTOR CERTIFICATION CLAUSES

1. **STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE:** Contractor has, unless exempted, complied with the nondiscrimination program requirements. (Gov. Code §12990 (a-f) and CCR, Title 2, Section 11102) (Not applicable to public entities.)
2. **DRUG-FREE WORKPLACE REQUIREMENTS:** Contractor will comply with the requirements of the Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1990 and will provide a drug-free workplace by taking the following actions:
 - a. Publish a statement notifying employees that unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensation, possession or use of a controlled substance is prohibited and specifying actions to be taken against employees for violations.
 - b. Establish a Drug-Free Awareness Program to inform employees about:
 - 1) the dangers of drug abuse in the workplace;
 - 2) the person's or organization's policy of maintaining a drug-free workplace;
 - 3) any available counseling, rehabilitation and employee assistance programs; and,

Failure to comply with these requirements may result in suspension of payments under the Agreement or termination of the Agreement or both and Contractor may be ineligible for award of any future State agreements if the department determines that any of the following has occurred: the Contractor has made false certification, or violated the certification by failing to carry out the requirements as noted above. (Gov. Code §8350 et seq.)

3. NATIONAL LABOR RELATIONS BOARD CERTIFICATION: Contractor certifies that no more than one (1) final unappealable finding of contempt of court by a Federal court has been issued against Contractor within the immediately preceding two-year period because of Contractor's failure to comply with an order of a Federal court, which orders Contractor to comply with an order of the National Labor Relations Board. 4. CONTRACTS FOR LEGAL SERVICES \$50,000 OR MORE- PRO BONO

REQUIREMENT: Contractor hereby certifies that Contractor will comply with the requirements of Section 6072 of the Business and Professions Code, effective January 1, 2003.

Contractor agrees to make a good faith effort to provide a minimum number of hours of pro bono legal services during each year of the contract equal to the lessor of 30 multiplied by the number of full time attorneys in the firm's offices in the State, with the number of hours prorated on an actual day basis for any contract period of less than a full year or 10% of its contract with the State.

Failure to make a good faith effort may be cause for non-renewal of a state contract for legal services, and may be taken into account when determining the award of future contracts with the State for legal services.

5. EXPATRIATE CORPORATIONS: Contractor hereby declares that it is not an expatriate corporation or subsidiary of an expatriate corporation within the meaning of Public Contract Code Section 10286 and 10286.1, and is eligible to contract with the State of California.

6. SWEATFREE CODE OF CONDUCT:

a. All Contractors contracting for the procurement or laundering of apparel, garments or corresponding accessories, or the procurement of equipment, materials, or supplies, other than procurement related to a public works contract, declare under penalty of perjury that no apparel, garments or corresponding accessories, equipment, materials, or supplies furnished to the state pursuant to the contract have been laundered or produced in whole or in part by sweatshop labor, forced labor, convict labor, indentured labor under penal sanction, abusive forms of child labor or exploitation of children in sweatshop labor, or with the benefit of sweatshop labor, forced labor, convict labor, indentured labor under penal sanction, abusive forms of child labor or exploitation of children in sweatshop labor. The contractor further declares under penalty of perjury that they adhere to the Sweatfree Code of Conduct as set forth on the California Department of Industrial Relations website located at www.dir.ca.gov, and Public Contract Code Section 6108.

b. The contractor agrees to cooperate fully in providing reasonable access to the contractor's records, documents, agents or employees, or premises if reasonably required by authorized

officials of the contracting agency, the Department of Industrial Relations, or the Department of Justice to determine the contractor's compliance with the requirements under paragraph (a).

7. DOMESTIC PARTNERS: For contracts of \$100,000 or more, Contractor certifies that Contractor is in compliance with Public Contract Code section 10295.3.

8. GENDER IDENTITY: For contracts of \$100,000 or more, Contractor certifies that Contractor is in compliance with Public Contract Code section 10295.35.

DOING BUSINESS WITH THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

The following laws apply to persons or entities doing business with the State of California.

1. CONFLICT OF INTEREST: Contractor needs to be aware of the following provisions regarding current or former state employees. If Contractor has any questions on the status of any person rendering services or involved with the Agreement, the awarding agency must be contacted immediately for clarification.

Current State Employees (Pub. Contract Code §10410):

- 1). No officer or employee shall engage in any employment, activity or enterprise from which the officer or employee receives compensation or has a financial interest and which is sponsored or funded by any state agency, unless the employment, activity or enterprise is required as a condition of regular state employment.
- 2). No officer or employee shall contract on his or her own behalf as an independent contractor with any state agency to provide goods or services.

Former State Employees (Pub. Contract Code §10411):

- 1). For the two-year period from the date he or she left state employment, no former state officer or employee may enter into a contract in which he or she engaged in any of the negotiations, transactions, planning, arrangements or any part of the decision-making process relevant to the contract while employed in any capacity by any state agency.
- 2). For the twelve-month period from the date he or she left state employment, no former state officer or employee may enter into a contract with any state agency if he or she was employed by that state agency in a policy-making position in the same general subject area as the proposed contract within the 12-month period prior to his or her leaving state service.

If Contractor violates any provisions of above paragraphs, such action by Contractor shall render this Agreement void. (Pub. Contract Code §10420)

Members of boards and commissions are exempt from this section if they do not receive payment other than payment of each meeting of the board or commission, payment for preparatory time and payment for per diem. (Pub. Contract Code §10430 (e))

2. LABOR CODE/WORKERS' COMPENSATION: Contractor needs to be aware of the provisions which require every employer to be insured against liability for Worker's Compensation or to undertake self-insurance in accordance with the provisions, and Contractor affirms to comply with such provisions before commencing the performance of the work of this Agreement. (Labor Code Section 3700)

3. AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT: Contractor assures the State that it complies with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) of 1990, which prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability, as well as all applicable regulations and guidelines issued pursuant to the ADA. (42 U.S.C. 12101 et seq.)

4. CONTRACTOR NAME CHANGE: An amendment is required to change the Contractor's name as listed on this Agreement. Upon receipt of legal documentation of the name change the State will process the amendment. Payment of invoices presented with a new name cannot be paid prior to approval of said amendment.

5. CORPORATE QUALIFICATIONS TO DO BUSINESS IN CALIFORNIA:

a. When agreements are to be performed in the state by corporations, the contracting agencies will be verifying that the contractor is currently qualified to do business in California in order to ensure that all obligations due to the state are fulfilled.

b. "Doing business" is defined in R&TC Section 23101 as actively engaging in any transaction for the purpose of financial or pecuniary gain or profit. Although there are some statutory exceptions to taxation, rarely will a corporate contractor performing within the state not be subject to the franchise tax.

c. Both domestic and foreign corporations (those incorporated outside of California) must be in good standing in order to be qualified to do business in California. Agencies will determine whether a corporation is in good standing by calling the Office of the Secretary of State.

6. RESOLUTION: A county, city, district, or other local public body must provide the State with a copy of a resolution, order, motion, or ordinance of the local governing body which by law has authority to enter into an agreement, authorizing execution of the agreement.

7. AIR OR WATER POLLUTION VIOLATION: Under the State laws, the Contractor shall not be: (1) in violation of any order or resolution not subject to review promulgated by the State Air Resources Board or an air pollution control district; (2) subject to cease and desist order not subject to review issued pursuant to Section 13301 of the Water Code for violation of waste discharge requirements or discharge prohibitions; or (3) finally determined to be in violation of provisions of federal law relating to air or water pollution.

8. PAYEE DATA RECORD FORM STD. 204: This form must be completed by all contractors that are not another state agency or other governmental entity.

CERTIFICATIONS REGARDING LOBBYING; DEBARMENT, SUSPENSION AND OTHER RESPONSIBILITY MATTERS; AND DRUG-FREE WORKPLACE REQUIREMENTS

(c) The undersigned shall require that the language of this certification be included in the award documents for all subawards at all tiers (including subgrants, contracts under grants and cooperative agreements, and subcontracts) and that all subrecipients shall certify and disclose accordingly.

2. DEBARMENT, SUSPENSION, AND OTHER RESPONSIBILITY MATTERS

As required by executive Order 12549, Debarment and Suspension, and other responsibilities implemented at 45 CFR Part 76, for prospective participants in primary or a lower tier covered transactions, as defined at 45 CFR Part 76, Sections 76.105 and 76.110.

A. The applicant certifies that it and its principals:

(a) Are not presently debarred, suspended proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from covered transactions by any federal department or agency;

(b) Have not within a three-year period preceding this application been convicted of or had a civil judgment rendered against them for commission of fraud or a criminal offense in connection with obtaining, attempting to obtain, or performing a public (federal, state, or local) transaction or contract under a public transaction violation of federal or State antitrust statutes or commission of embezzlement, theft, forgery, bribery, falsification or destruction of records, making false statements, or receiving stolen property;

3. DRUG-FREE WORKPLACE (GRANTEES OTHER THAN INDIVIDUALS)

As required by the Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1988, and implemented at 45 CFR Part 76, Subpart F, for grantees, as defined at 45 CFR Part 76, Sections 76.805 and 76.810-

A. The applicant certifies that it will or will continue to provide a drug-free workplace by:

(1) Taking appropriate personnel action against such an employee, up to and including termination, consistent with the requirements of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended; or

(2) Requiring such employee to participate satisfactorily in a drug abuse assistance or rehabilitation program approved for such purposes by a federal, state, or local health, law enforcement, or other appropriate agency;

(g) Making a good faith effort to continue to maintain a drug-free workplace through implementation of paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), and (f).


