 Approval to proclaim September 2018 National Preparedness Month in Stanislaus County.

# **DISCUSSION:**

Launched in 2004, National Preparedness Month is FEMA's national annual preparedness outreach that aims to educate and empower Americans during the month of September and throughout the year to prepare for, and respond to, all types of emergencies, including natural disasters and potential terrorist attacks. Sponsored by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), National Preparedness Month encourages Americans to take simple steps to prepare for emergencies in their homes, neighborhoods, businesses, schools, and communities. Information is also provided for pet owners, seniors and individuals with access and functional needs. Resources are available in thirteen languages, including English and Spanish. Last year, the Stanislaus County Board of Supervisors approved a resolution proclaiming September 2017 National Preparedness Month.

This year, the Office of Emergency Services is requesting that the Board of Supervisors approve a resolution proclaiming September 2018 National Preparedness Month. The theme for 2018 is "Disasters Happen. Prepare Now. Learn How." Throughout the month, information will be disseminated via email to county employees, as well as Operational Area members and partner agencies, on how they can prepare for emergencies individually and as employees. This information will include information on how to make an emergency plan, learn life-saving skills, and how to save for an emergency. In addition, the Office of Emergency Services will be providing preparedness information to the public via stanemergency.com as well as through social media each week of September.

# POLICY ISSUE:

Approval to proclaim September 2018 National Preparedness Month encourages County employees, Operational Area members, partner agencies, and the public to take action to prepare now and throughout the year for the types of emergencies and disasters that could affect Stanislaus County.

### FISCAL IMPACT:

Current Office of Emergency Services staff will create and disseminate the weekly messages during the month of September via County email, stanemergency.com, and social media. Additional duties associated with this program will be absorbed by existing staff.

#### BOARD OF SUPERVISORS' PRIORITY:

Approval to proclaim September 2018 National Preparedness Month supports the Board's priority of *Supporting Strong & Safe Neighborhoods*.

#### **STAFFING IMPACT:**

Existing staff from the Office of Emergency Services will provide National Preparedness Month and *Ready* Campaign information to the County departments, Operational Area Council members and partner agencies, and the general public.
