2. Presentation, discussion, and possible action regarding a PFF waiver request of \$43,421 from Modesto Free Will Baptist Church for the affordable housing project at 225 East Orangeburg Avenue, Modesto.

In attendance, representing the request, was Kevin Smith, Stanislaus Equity Partners (STEP) Housing Director. Modesto Free Will Baptist Church is the owner of the project, and

STEP helped to bring the project together. Modesto Family Promise will host two units, and Center for Human Services will host seven units, for a total of nine units, ranging from two to four bedrooms each.

Funding of \$1.5 million was received from CalAIM & HealthNet. The homes are built on the church grounds and are to be utilized to house families that are homeless or at risk of homelessness. One hundred percent of the units will be for families whose median income is below 50% of the AMI. There is a 10-year covenant to keep the housing affordable.

Two public hearings were held in the City of Modesto, and concerns were raised from the neighboring church about the proximity of the housing to its children's playground. A block wall was built between Modesto Free Will Baptist Church and the neighboring church which served to ease those concerns.

Member Doud moved to approve a deferral of the PFF fee citing page 9 of the PFF Committee Administrative Guidelines Section E.1.b. which states that "housing developed for occupancy by very low-income households shall be afforded the opportunity to waive the entire fee," and "a contract shall be executed and recorded that indicates the waiver status along with instructions regarding future payment should the very low-income status not be maintained."

The Parks Department has no committed project funds currently, and \$4,400,023 in the 2405 Regional Parks Fund as well as \$276 in the 6405 Parks Fund are available per the PFF April 30, 2024, report.

## **Project Description:**

The Department of Parks and Recreation (Department) operates and maintains the Frank Raines Regional Park (FRRP), which is located at 17802 Del Puerto Canyon Road, Patterson, California. The Park is divided functionally into two sections separated by several miles of road. The west section encompasses over 1,500 acres of developed and undeveloped areas with off-road vehicle trails, overnight camping accommodations including full hook-up and undeveloped sites, day use areas, a recreation hall, showers/restrooms, a group picnic area, and other outdoor recreational trails for biking, hiking, wildlife viewing, and bird watching. The east section, called the Minnier Area, is approximately 1,000 acres and is earmarked as open space for hiking, horseback riding, hunting, wildlife and bird watching, and mountain biking. The Park also includes additional land in the northwestern area of Del Puerto Canyon for potential expansion of outdoor recreational activities such as off-road vehicle use. Park users to the Frank Raines OHV Area will be challenged with vertical hill climbs, man-made water hazards, and rugged trails. Trail ratings range from beginner to expert.

# PFF Committee Meetings are held the 3<sup>rd</sup> Thursday of each month. The deadline to submit requests for consideration is ten (10) days prior to the scheduled meeting date.

Parks staff perform the day-to-day operation and maintenance of the FRRP. The Department receives annual grant awards from the State of California's Off Highway Vehicle Grants program. In doing so, it is required to abide by the State's Soil Conservation Standards, to maintain a safe trail system and to reduce and or mitigate erosion. FRRP has numerous soil catchment ponds that capture soil that has eroded from the trail system by wind, water or mechanical means. Captured soils are excavated from these catchment ponds and used to repair the trail tread of approximately 30 miles of OHV trails and fire roads. Due to the topography of the Frank Raines trail system, transporting these reclaimed soils up, steep and off camber, ridgeline trails can only be accomplished with a tracked unit capable of excavating and carrying loads of soils in an efficient manner. The Department will be purchasing new equipment to expand the use of FRRP. The John Deere 655K Crawler Loader, with an estimated cost of \$331,889, is the piece of equipment that is needed to maintain the Frank Raines OHV Park trail system in this capacity.
