Preceding Legislation in

Assembly Bill 1668 and **Senate Bill (SB) 606** (passed in June 2018) outlined directives related to urban and agricultural water use efficiency and <u>countywide drought</u> <u>resiliency</u>.

- 10609.40(a) Small water suppliers and rural communities are often not covered by established water shortage planning requirements [...]
- 1060940(b) The state should provide guidance to improve drought planning for small water suppliers and rural communities.
- 10609.42(a) No later than January 1, 2020, the department [...] shall use available data to identify small water suppliers and rural communities that may be at risk of drought and water shortage vulnerability [...], propose to the Governor and the Legislature recommendations and guidance relating to the development and implementation of countywide drought and water shortage contingency plans to address the planning needs of small water suppliers and rural communities.



Preceding Legislation III Senate Bill 552 Requirements

- A County shall
 - establish a standing county drought and water shortage task force to facilitate drought and water shortage preparedness for state small water systems and domestic wells within the county's jurisdiction.
 - develop a County Drought Resilience Plan that includes potential drought and water shortage risk and proposed interim and long-term solutions.

Definitions

* Refer to the Water Code or <u>Primer-of-SB-552-052522_final.pdf (ca.gov)</u> for other related definitions.

• State small water systems: A system for the provision of piped water to the public for human consumption that serves at least 5, but not more than 14, service connections and does not regularly serve drinking water to more than an average of 25 individuals daily for more than 60 days out of the year, as defined in Section 116275 (n) of the Health and Safety Code.

Water Code §10609.51(k)

 Domestic well: A groundwater well used to supply water for the domestic needs of an individual residence or a water system that is not a public water system and that has no more than 4 service connections, as defined in Section 116681 of the Health and Safety Code.


Water Code §10609.51(m)

- Drought: A period of abnormally dry weather that results in water shortages.
- Water Shortage: a condition in which the demand for water exceeds the available supply.


Senate Bill 552 provides these definitions and is intended to help small water suppliers and rural communities prepare for and respond to droughts and water shortages, regardless of the source of their water supply.

Stanislaus County Drought Resilience Plan

- Stand alone document
- Can support County Plans such as:
 - County General Plan
 - Hazard Mitigation Plans
 - Climate Action Plans
- Facilitates drought and water shortage preparedness for:
 - State Small Water Systems
 - Domestic wells including reported dry or reduced capacity for various reasons Plan for the future



Organizational Framework



Drought and Water Shortage Task Force Responsibilities

Provide input on current water supply conditions, data, and feedback



Review drought conditions, identify problems, and develop actionable solutions



Support SB 552 implementation and County Drought Resilience Plan development



Disseminate Task Force findings and recommendations









Task Force Formation

- CWC 10609.70 (a)(1) and (2) represent the governing regulatior for the Task Force membership for counties.
 - Other than the requirement that the county "must" establis task force, the membership is loose: 10609.70(a)(1) says the county "shall invite" representatives from certain groups.
 - There are no other requirements, making membership the discretion of the county.
 - Example: If a county says it wants to be an (a)(1) ta force, it would only need to document the county trie to invite people/organizations from those categories.
 - Note that 10609.80 applies to DWR and makes involvementh these parties a requirement for DWR's Task Force.
 - The main role of the Task Force or alternative process will to facilitate drought and water shortage preparedness, as illustrated by the disaster risk management framework shov in Figure 2-1.

Direct Technical Assistance

County Drought Resilience Planning Assistance Program



... counties can request up to \$125,000 in **financial assistance** or **Direct Technical Assistance** (DTA) to support their planning efforts.

County submits the online DTA application to DWR.



DWR reviews the applications and coordinates with the applicant.



Stantec develops workplan for the county based on its self-identified needs.






